Andy Kusma Memorial Award

Andy's sports career started when he was a shy, young boy in New Jersey playing little league baseball. After relocating to Pennsylvania as a fourth grader, Andy discovered sports as a positive way of interacting with others. Sports would continue to shape his life and the person he became. Andy found positive influences from coaches throughout his sports career and looked to them for guidance.

This scholarship was created by Andy's friends and family with the help of the NPAAA, to help keep his memory and dedication to sports alive, after losing his battle with pancreatic cancer on December 25, 2007. Andy understood the importance of a college education, and the struggle many families have with the growing cost of tuition. It was his dream to be able to reward the athletes of North Penn Athletics, by allowing them the opportunity to continue their athletic careers while receiving a college education.

In 2008, the North Penn Athletic Alumni Association presented 3 male athletes with the first scholarship in the name of Andy Kusma. The Andy Kusma Scholarship Fund has continued to grow since then, through in-kind donations and proceeds from the Andy Kusma Memorial Golf Tournament, now in its second year.

A History of the North Penn School System

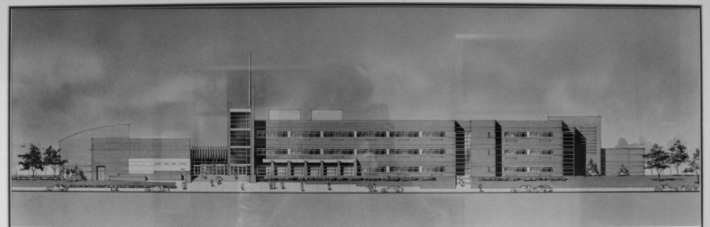
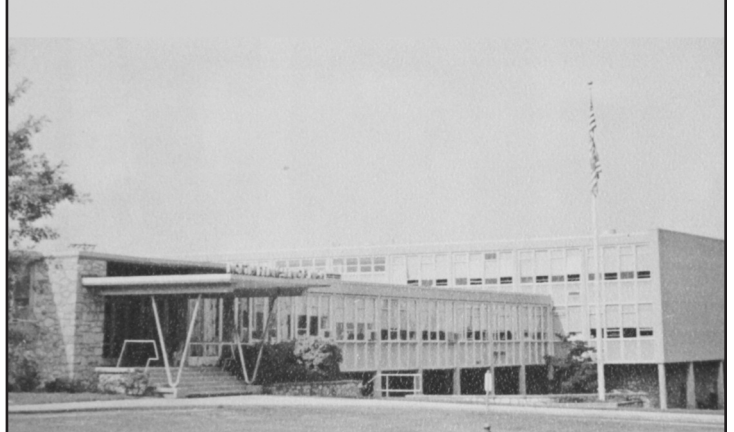
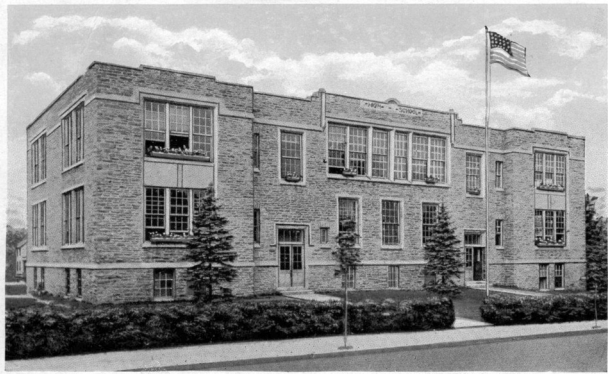
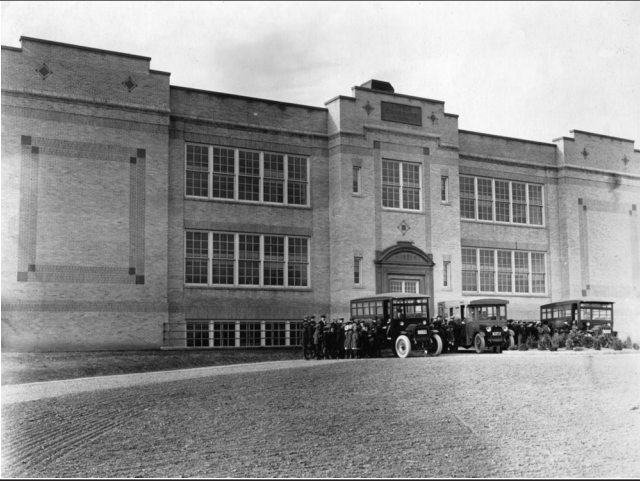
The roots of public education in the North Penn area predate the Civil War when simple one-room schoolhouses dotted the countryside. They offered schooling at the most basic level because all the primary grades were taught by a single teacher in that one-room environment. Students who wanted “higher” education had to travel to a town where advanced courses were available. As villages grew into larger boroughs in the 1880s, 12-year diploma programs were offered in these schools, and senior classes evolved – some with as few as a single student.

Lansdale School District was formed in 1871, a year before the community became an incorporated borough. In 1872, its first public school was built on East Main Street. The first graduating class in 1888 consisted of four students. The original school on Main Street was replaced by the larger Broad Street and Green Street schools in 1888 and 1899, respectively, but it was not until 1914 that the first Lansdale High School was built. An influx of new industries and affordable residential housing quickly pushed the high school building past capacity, and in 1930 the school board agreed to build a new high school on Penn Street, where there would be plenty of room for future expansion. Because of this foresight, the second Lansdale High School stood the test of time much better than its predecessor. Over a period of 40 years, the campus grew to serve a total of seven towns and townships in the region. When regional consolidation took place in 1955, the Penn Street school underwent a massive expansion project that more than doubled the size of the original school. In June 1955, the final Lansdale High School diplomas were awarded, and three months later North Penn High School was born.

Like Lansdale, Hatfield’s education system evolved from one-room schools into a larger school that began offering advanced grades during the 1890s. Hatfield Consolidated School District was formed in 1921 when residents of the borough and township agreed to erect a modern high school on the borough-township line in 1921. The new facility contained 19 rooms and was built on a 10 1/2-acre tract at Fairgrounds and Cowpath Roads. When the building opened in September 1922, it was the first six-year high school in this part of the state. A total of 492 students were brought together under the same roof, taught by a 15-member faculty. Hatfield High featured the largest auditorium and gymnasium between Philadelphia and the Lehigh Valley. Now the home of the Biblical Theological Seminary, Hatfield High School’s last graduates received their diplomas in 1955. The high school closed its doors on June 10, 1955, and in September, 1955, Hatfield’s underclassmen began attending the North Penn Joint High School in Lansdale.

Public education in North Wales also began with a one-room school located on Main Street that was built before the town was incorporated in 1869. The bustling young town soon outgrew its first schoolhouse and a new one was erected at Third and School Sts. By the 1890s that structure also proved inadequate and a three-story addition was built to house all 12 grades. North Wales held its first commencement in 1887 – with one student receiving a diploma. The School Street building was replaced in 1928 by what is now North Wales Elementary School on Summit Street. Like Lansdale and Hatfield, North Wales became a part of the North Penn Jointure in 1955, ending the era of independent school districts – and high schools – in each town.

To come full circle, the post-World War II construction boom impacted the once rural townships of Hatfield, Montgomery, Upper Gwynedd and Towamencin much like the rapid growth the borough experienced a half-century earlier. The venerable Lansdale/North Penn High School was no longer able to contain the influx of new students. In 1971 a new, massive high school campus was built in Towamencin, and Penn Street was converted into what is now Penndale Middle School.

The History of the North Penn Alumni Athletic Association Two Hall of Fames

The NPAAA was founded in the year 2000 with a mission to uphold the standards and prestige of the North Penn High School athletic program and to encourage and promote higher education through scholarship awards to those student athletes who demonstrate courage and sacrifice during their athletic careers. The NPAAA expanded its mission in 2004 when a decision was made by the Board of Directors to establish a sports Hall of Fame to recognize those alumni from North Penn High School and its legacy schools who best exemplified those high standards while participating in athletics in the high school.

After the NPAAA voted to initiate an athletic Hall of Fame, the Board of Directors proceeded with defining its vision. First, the NPAAA had to establish a qualification criteria and organizational guidelines to provide a systematic methodology for selecting inductees. Once that was established, the NPAAA created three committees: one to research, prioritize and select the inductees; a second to determine appropriate inductee awards and method of recognition; and a third to initiate a fundraising campaign to provide the monies necessary to support the NPAAA's dual mission of scholarship awards and athletic recognition.

The mission of the NPAAA is sustained by a desire to provide future generations with a historical record of the outstanding student athletes and teams representing North Penn High School and its legacy schools (Hatfield High School, Lansdale High School, and North Wales High School). This history, which provides both a source of pride and a standard to emulate, dates back to 1887.

On October 8, 2005, the NPAAA hosted its Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony at North Penn High School. Fifty two athletes (spanning eight decades) and one team were inducted. The ceremony was attended by several hundred people and included the enthusiastic endorsement and participation of North Penn School District Officials. A program was provided that included the history of the schools, a history of the team inducted, and profiles of the inducted athletes. An announcement was made at this event about plans to establish a permanent Hall of Fame Wall in North Penn High School. This initiative was presented to North Penn High School Officials and was enthusiastically approved.

A fundraising campaign was initiated immediately following the Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Event and by Mid-August 2006, the NPAAA raised sufficient funding to proceed with the creation of the

Hall of Fame Wall. A vendor was selected to provide the raised metal plaques that would be installed on the Wall of Fame in North Penn High School.


In addition, The North Penn Alumni Athletic Association, as part of its Sports Hall of Fame mission, gives Special Recognition to teams that did not achieve PIAA State Championship level, but won league a championship along with other NPHS league championship teams in any given year; or a team(s) that in the opinion of the NPAAA Board of Directors should be recognized for their unique contribution to North Penn High School sports history.

Three special recognition plaques have been installed on the Wall of Honor. On May 16, 2011, the NPAAA Board of Directors again approved the expansion of its current mission of providing scholarships to senior student athletes and the creation of the Sports Hall of Fame, to establishing a “Lifetime Achievement Hall of Fame” to be installed in North Penn High School. The NPAAA has expanded its mission to honor North Penn High School and Legacy School graduates who have made significant contributions to society in the Arts, Business, Education, Legal, Medical, Performing Arts, Public Service, or the Sciences fields of endeavor.

This initiative was presented to, and approved by, the North Penn School District Superintendent and North Penn High School Principal. The NPAAA has been provided a wall at North Penn High School (separate from the Athletic Wall of Honor) to display inductee profile plaques. This year (2014) we are inducting our fourth Lifetime Achievement award winner.

Since 2005 and including the Event on October 10, 2015 we have installed 140 plaques for the individual athletes, 31 team plaques, 5 Lifetime Achievement plaques, and 5 special recognition plaques on the Halls of Fame Walls of Honor.

Pat Henry was hired as an administrator in the Harvard Department of Athletics in 1980. Today she serves as the Senior Associate Director of Athletics for the largest intercollegiate athletic program in the country. Harvard supports 42 varsity sports. As a member of the senior management team, she is responsible for the programmatic and strategic planning administration of all intercollegiate, club sports, intramurals and recreation. Among numerous initiatives she created the Harvard Radcliffe Foundation for Women's Athletics. This program has broadened the base of support for all of women's sports and helped influenced fundraising across all the sports programs. Harvard University, as a member of the Ivy League, sponsors a robust collegiate program that supports over 1,200 varsity student athletes and has nearly 3,000 students participating in club sports and intramurals. For example, some highlights from 2014 - Harvard won 10 Ivy League Championships, named its 54th Rhodes Scholar, hosted ESPN's GameDay prior to the Harvard-Yale Football Game, and placed 2nd in the NCAA Championship in Women's Field Hockey.

Throughout her three decade tenure at Harvard she has held various leadership positions in organizations that support sports and higher education. In service to the US Olympic Committee she managed the Olympic Village for 6 Olympic Soccer games held in Harvard Stadium as part of the 1984 Los Angeles Olympic Games, represented the US and lectured at various international Olympic conferences and was a member of the USOC Education Committee for 2 decades, serving as its chair from 1993-96. She served as President of the Boston Local Organizing Committee for the 2006 NCAA Women's Final Four Basketball Championship.

Patricia Henry has been a member of Harvard's senior administration in the department of athletics since 1980. She currently serves as the department's Senior Associate Director of Athletics. Henry oversees the programming of the largest Division I varsity athletics program in the nation. She is responsible for the development and well-being of nearly 1,200 student-athletes and 42 varsity teams.

Pat was a catalyst behind the successful effort to bring the 2006 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four to Boston. She served as president of the local organizing committee for that event, which generated \$25 million in revenue to the Boston economy.

Henry is the founder of the Harvard Radcliffe Foundation for Women's Athletics, which has greatly enhanced and broadened the programming and financial support for women's athletics programs at the university since the foundation's inception in 1981. Pat has served on a number of visiting committees and advisory boards at other institutions and currently a trustee emeritus at her alma mater, Gettysburg College, receiving its Distinguished Alumni Award in 2009.

Henry also has worked with amateur athletics in a number of different capacities on the national and international levels. She has served on the United States Olympic Women's Rowing Committee and as secretary of the United States Olympic Committee Education Council and was co-coordinator of the 1984 Olympic soccer matches that were played in Harvard Stadium. She has been a delegate to the Taiwan Olympic Academy and was a lecturer and representative of the USOC at the Korean Olympic Academy. Henry has served on the NCAA men's and women's swimming committee and is a former member of the Eastern College Athletic Conference executive council. Her work in collegiate athletics recently led to her being named as one of eight 2007 National Association of Collegiate Women Athletics Administrators (NACWAA) Administrators of the Year.

Before coming to Harvard, Henry had spent 10 years as a teacher and swimming coach at North Penn High School in Lansdale, PA. As a coach, she won eight league championships, one PIAA State Title and saw four individuals and 11 relay teams achieve All-America status. She was inducted into the North Penn Alumni Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

Henry is a 1971 graduate of Gettysburg, where she was a standout in field hockey and basketball and was chosen as the school's Outstanding Female Athlete as a senior. She holds a bachelor's degree in Health and Physical Education and was inducted into Gettysburg's Athletics Hall of Fame in 1987. Henry earned a Master's Degree in Health and Physical Education from West Chester State College in 1975.

The term student-athlete is one that Dave tried to embody throughout his high school and collegiate career. As a multi-sport athlete at North Penn, Dave enjoyed success in both football and track and field receiving a total of 9 varsity letters. His career began as a 9th grader working out with the football team in the under-sized weight room and culminated with All-State and All-American honors in football, a 3rd place shot put finish at the PIAA State Championships, and the National Football Foundation & Hall of Fame Scholar Athlete Award in 1999.

Upon graduating from North Penn, Dave attended Penn State University on a football scholarship. He earned a reputation for hard work and dedication both in the classroom and on the field. He was recognized in 2002 with the Frank Patrick Memorial "Total Commitment" Award, and in 2003 with the Red Worrell Award for exemplary conduct. He started every game for the Nittany Lions at center in 2003 and that same year was named one of Sports Illustrated's "Smartest Players in College Football." Dave was named to the Academic All-Big Ten Team three times and earned CoSIDA Academic All-American honors in 2003. He was named Penn State's Most Outstanding Offensive Lineman in 2003 and represented Penn State in the Las Vegas All-American Classic after his senior season.

During his time at Penn State, Dave also co-founded the non-profit organization LIFT FOR LIFE to raise money and awareness for Kidney Cancer after the disease affected several teammates' families' members. The Penn State University chapter of LIFT FOR LIFE, now known as UPLIFTING ATHLETES, continues today and has raised more than \$1 million for the Kidney Cancer Association. UPLIFTING ATHLETES continues to expand nationally with more than 25 college football programs joining together working against rare diseases and raising them as a national priority through outreach, research, education, and advocacy.

Dave finished his undergraduate degree in 2003 and earned his master's degree in 2004. He went on to work for IBM's Global Business Services group for 4 years in the Washington D.C. area. Dave currently works as the Marketing Manager for Minitab Inc., a global provider of statistical software and services.

Dave is a dedicated husband to his wife, Annie, and proud father of their two children, Zach (6) and Natalie (4). He enjoys spending free time with family and friends and coaching local youth sports teams.

Dave is humbled to be inducted into the North Penn Athletic Hall of Fame and would like to thank Coaches Dick Beck, Richard Swanker, Tim Kulig and Ron Jaros for their guidance and mentorship during his time at North Penn. "It's an honor to be associated with such an outstanding group of coaches and athletes. I hope I can continue to represent North Penn and the community with great pride and success."

Daniel is honored to be part of the 2015 class of inductees being elected into the North Penn Athletic Hall of Fame. He was the first NPHS wrestler to be called up from the junior high level to participate on the NPHS varsity program enabling him to win 4 wrestling varsity letters. He was a four-time Sectional Champion, three-time District 1 Champion and three-time Southeast Regional Champion and took home the 1987 Southeast Regional Outstanding Wrestler honors. He was the wrestling program's first 100th win wrestler and was a three-time PIAA State place winner. He earned 4th and 6th place medal honors at the PIAA State Championships and won the 1987 PIAA State Champion title at 112lbs. That 1987 title contributed to the team's securing the wrestling program's only PIAA Wrestling Team State Championship. Dan was previously elected to the North Penn Athletic Hall of Fame as part of the 1987 PIAA State Championship Team in 2007. Dan was also elected in 1999 to the District 1 Wrestling Hall of Fame. Dan compiled an overall career record of 123-13-1.

After graduation, Dan accepted a wrestling scholarship to participate in NCAA Division I athletics for Rider University where he was a four-time Rider University letter winner, two-time NCAA Division I Qualifier, and two-time NCAA Division I East Coast Conference Champion. While at Rider University, Dan compiled a record of 98-23 and received two Bachelors of Science degrees, one in Organizational Behavior & Management and one in Human Resource Management. Upon graduation, Dan accepted the Assistant Wrestling Coach position from Drexel University 1995-1997.

During the 1996–97 seasons, the North Penn Boy's Water Polo Team and Swimming & Diving Team captured Pennsylvania State Championship titles. As a result, North Penn became the first school to capture both aquatic titles in the same school year.

Leading the Knights domination of the pool was Steve Johnston, who earned All American Honors in water polo and swimming. Steve led the North Penn boy's water polo team by becoming the first high school to defeat perennial power house Wilson, West Lawn in the State Championship game. Later that year, Steve played a major role in the Knight's Swimming and Diving state championship title by leading all three relays to gold medals and a 5th place in the 100 yard backstroke. Steve's most impressive accomplishment was being named to the Academic All-American team by the National Interscholastic Swimming Coaches Association.

Upon graduating from North Penn in 1997, Steve swam at Division III Grove City College and qualified to swim in the 100 Backstroke at the NCAA Division III Championships in his freshman year. He also had the opportunity to help start Varsity Men and Women's Water Polo Programs. Steve was recognized as a Division III All-American for Water Polo in 2000 and a Division III Academic All-American for Water Polo from 1999-2001. In his senior year, Steve was named the Grove City College Sportsman of the Year and graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Accounting.

After college, Steve joined Deloitte & Touche LLP and traveled from Pittsburgh to Philadelphia to Fairfield, CT as his wife, Lindsay, completed medical training to become a Neonatologist. Steve still calls Fairfield home and now works for General Re. He spends most of his time raising triplets (Ashley, Christian and Zachary) with Lindsay and traveling with the family whenever possible.

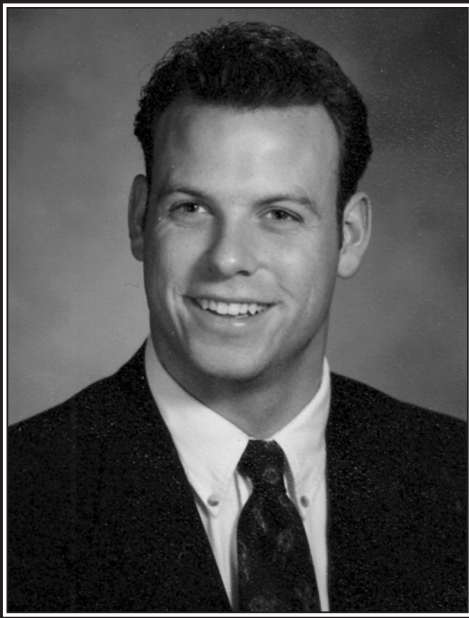
Throughout her high school career, her teams won 6 Bux-Mont championships! She wants to give credit to the wonderful women athletes who played with her on those teams for achieving that goal, many of whom are in this very Hall of Fame.

After high school, Chris attended East Stroudsburg State College and played field hockey and basketball for the school. During her sophomore year, she was invited to play in the United States Field Hockey championship tournament in Los Angeles, California. She was named an Honorable Mention All American field hockey player that year. She continued to play field hockey for 3 more years. As a college basketball player, Chris was a “rover.” During this time, girls’ basketball was beginning to transition from a 6 girl team to a 5 girl team. There were 2 defensive players on one end of the court, 2 on offense at the other end of the court, and 2 rovers who were able to run the whole court.

She received a B.S. and M.Ed. in Health Education and General Science. She also took courses at Temple University and Delaware Valley College. After college, Chris taught Health and Physical Education at East Stroudsburg and in the North Penn School District. She later took a permanent teaching position in the Pennridge School District elementary schools, and taught second, third, and fourth grades for 20 years. Chris retired from teaching in 2004 after a total of 26.5 very rewarding years.

Between 1989 and 1992 the North Penn Boys Swimming and Diving team won three PIAA State Championships, four District Championships, four Suburban I Championships and went undefeated in dual meet competition. The National Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association consistently ranked North Penn among the top programs in the country. The accomplishments of the North Penn Swimming and Diving team during these years reflect the accomplishments, hard work and dedication of many individuals. Among these individuals was John Raeburn, whose talent, leadership and work ethic were an intricate and invaluable part of the team's success.

In 1989 the future of North Penn Swimming and Diving became very bright as John Raeburn, Kevin Faikish, Matt Krystopa, Chris Lee, Jamie Tang and Derek Williams joined the team as freshmen. These individuals, over the course of four years, would rewrite the North Penn record book and become the foundation of the 1990, 1991 and 1992 PIAA State Championships teams. What was unique about this freshman class was not only their exceptional talent, but also their diversity of talent in covering all the strokes and events within one class. With upperclassmen filling in the gaps in the early years and underclassmen filling in the gaps in the later years, North Penn's future was golden.

As a freshman, John quickly made an impact in the lineup and became the team's top breaststroke and sprint freestyler. Over the course of his years at North Penn, John and various combinations of his teammates won four PIAA STATE Relay Gold Medals, set three state relay records and achieved All-American recognition four times. In 1991, the 200 Medley Relay of Kevin Faikish, John Raeburn, Derek Williams and Andrew Serang won a state gold medal. The 200 Freestyle Relay of Scott Walker, John Raeburn, Jerry Gilbert and Matt Krystopa also won a state gold medal, set a PIAA state record, and earned All-American recognition. In 1992, John's senior year, the 200 Medley Relay of Kevin Faikish, John Raeburn, Derek Williams and Andrew Serang won a state gold medal, set a PIAA state record and earned All-American recognition. The 200 Freestyle Relay of Derek Williams, Andrew Serang, John Raeburn and Matt Krystopa won a state gold medal and earned All-American recognition. In 1991, as a junior, John was recognized as the District I Outstanding Swimmer having won four District I championships in the 50 Freestyle, 100 Breaststroke, 200 Medley Relay and the 200 Freestyle Relay. In 1992, as a senior, John placed second in the 100 Breaststroke at the PIAA State Championships. As a four year state qualifier, John earned PIAA All -State recognition in relays and as an individual seven different times.

In 1992, as seniors, John Raeburn and Derek Williams were selected by their teammates as co-captains. John's selection as a team captain confirmed what coaches and teammates had seen evolving in John over the previous three years; John embodied the work ethic, dedication and traditions of the North Penn program. Leading by example, John never backed down from a challenge in practice or in competition. John had the unique ability to laugh and joke with his teammates, call out a teammate who was not doing his best, support a teammate in need and in the moment of competition look fearlessly at the challenge. In victory, as well in defeat, John was always humble and held the ideals of his team and sportsmanship above all else.

Twenty- four years later John is the proud parent of a North Penn Swimmer. To this day, when you watch John in the stands at a meet, he embodies the spirit of North Penn Swimming and Diving. The positive attitude, his belief in the team, and his pride in the accomplishments of the team define his character.

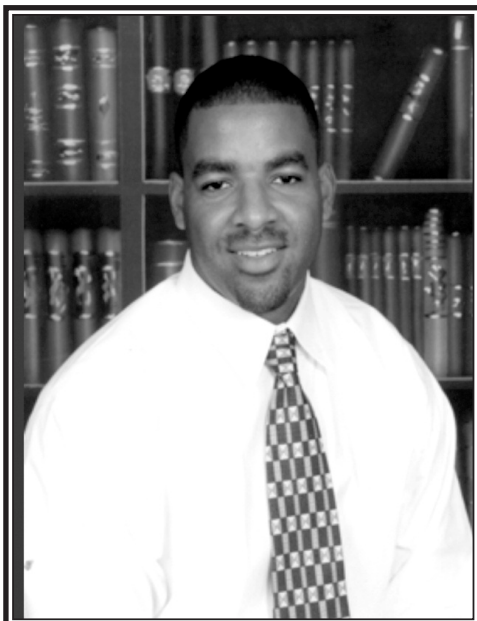
Swimming the 50 freestyle is truly an art. Within a fraction of a second, the race can be won or lost... in the start...with the turn... or at the finish. For swimmers who compete in longer events, it is difficult to imagine controlling the coordination and reaction time necessary for success in a sprint. Swimmers, who compete in this event, will try to perfect the most subtle high speed movements that can give them an advantage. Andrew Serang had the gift of raw speed in the water; was able to perfect sprinting technique, which gave him the command of the 50 freestyler during his years at North Penn.

In the fall of 1991, Andrew Serang joined the North Penn Swimming and Diving team as a freshman. The 1991 season had been one of the most successful in the history of the program; the team had won the Suburban I Championships, the District I Championships, and the PIAA State Championships. With the returning talent it was obvious that the team would once again be contending for a state title, despite the fact that some exceptional talent had been lost to graduation. Throughout the course of the 1991-92 season, Andrew excelled in the 50 freestyle and earned the opportunity to anchor the 200 yard Medley Relay. The 200 Medley Relay of Kevin Faikish, John Raeburn, Derek Williams and Andrew Serang won a gold medal at Districts and set a District I record. This relay also went on to win a Gold Medal at the PIAA State Championships. As a freshman Andrew fearlessly handled the anchor leg pressure and his splits were exceptional. The North Penn Swimming and Diving team went on to win its third consecutive District I title and second consecutive PIAA State title with Andrew playing a key role.

In 1992 all eyes were once again on North Penn as the team sought an unprecedented third straight PIAA State Championship. With the graduation of the 1991 senior class, North Penn had lost significant depth in the lineup; but what the team lacked in depth, it made up for in quality. The 200 yard Medley Relay of Kevin Faikish, John Raeburn, Derek Williams and Andrew Serang hoped to repeat their success from the previous year. In the District meet they won gold and once again broke the District I record. At the PIAA State meet they won the Gold Medal and broke the PIAA State Record. The 200 Freestyle Relay of Derek Williams, Andrew Serang, John Raeburn and Matt Krystopa also won gold medals at the District I and PIAA State championships and set both District I and PIAA State Records. Andrew was a sophomore and he had already been a part of winning three gold medals at states.

As a junior in 1993, Andrew would establish himself as one of the dominant sprinters in the state of Pennsylvania. In the District I championships the 200 yard Medley Relay of Don Walsh, Travis Raeburn, Joel Gilbert and Andrew Serang won gold with Andrew as the anchor leg for the third consecutive year.

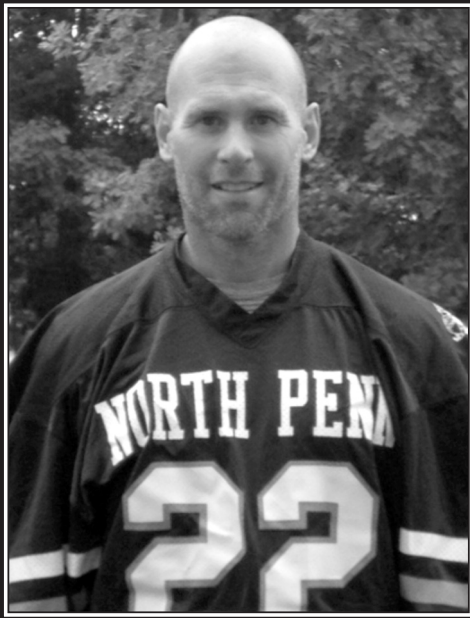

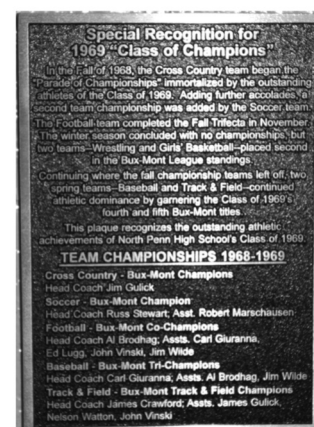
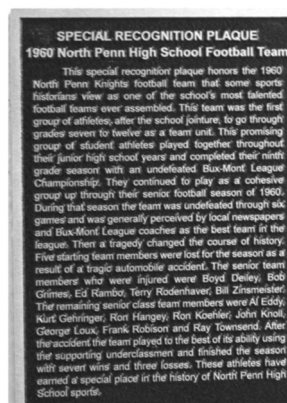

“Be Tough and Coachable”

Going into the 2006 Indoor Track season, the North Penn Knights had as many questions as they had answers. On one hand, the team knew they had multiple returning State medalists, a great coaching staff, and a reputation as a perennial powerhouse in the State of Pennsylvania. Still, the team had relay spots to fill, not only in their vaunted 4x800 meter relay, but in the other relays as well. Having lost a State Champion miler, and many other key cogs, could this team truly hope to compete for a State Championship? Who would step up? And then there was, perhaps, the most important question of all. How would the Knights fair with a head coach not named Dick Swanker for the first time in 24 years?

As Coach Jay Jones entered his inaugural campaign at the helm, carrying on the tradition of excellence would not be easy. Cold November days turned into colder January nights and the Knights worked to answer all the questions that nagged them. They went from running laps around the hallways of North Penn, to running laps around the bus circle outside of the school, to finally competing on indoor tracks across Eastern PA. “Be tough and coachable,” Coach Jones continued to preach.

While February and championship season could be seen on the horizon, the North Penn boys were finding their identity and settling into a groove. Coach Jones had managed to pick up where Coach Swanker had left off. Jay Jones and his staff had the team winning events from Lehigh to Glen Mills.

With a few weeks left to qualify for the State meet, the Knights were answering all the questions from early on. The sprinters were emerging as solid contributors. In the field, two triple jumpers, two hurdlers, and a shot-putter had all qualified to compete at Penn State. Sure, Coach Swank had retired, but he remained at almost every practice and meet. The final peace to the puzzle came from the most surprising place: three extraordinary sophomores (Zach Mojito, Stephen Franks, and Justin Bookheimer) rounded out the distance crew, making the 4x800 once again, a threat to compete for a State title.

The Boys arrived at the State Championship meet with one goal, “Win it all.” In order to do so, they would have to beat the favorite and last year’s Champion, Simon Gratz. Unfortunately, the meet started out with disaster when Elliot Johnson was tripped and leaped over during the 4x200m relay, causing the team of Brandon Turner, Chris Parris, Johnson, and Chris Dollinger to only finish 4th place.

The team rallied around this disappointment. Jim Green took 5th place in the Shot Put. Chris Parris came back and hurdled his way to 4th place in the 60m Hurdles. Brandon Turner and Tylon Hughes managed to take 1st and 4th respectively in the Triple Jump, earning 15 points for the team. After the 4x800m team of Montijo, Bookheimer, Phil Wright, and Cody Edling gutted out a thrilling victory, the Championship was closer than they had ever imagined. With a State Championship hanging in the balance, the 4x400m relay team of Dollinger, Edling, Turner, and Wright placed 3rd and secured the victory!

Coach Jones hoisted the State Championship Trophy in his first season as head coach, and the team celebrated from that moment until the bus arrived back at the high school hours later!

2007 Boys Cross Country Team PIAA AAA State Championship

2007 had special meaning for the North Penn Boys Cross Country team. Members knew it from the day each picked up their summer workout packet from Coach Ron Jaros and Assistant Coach Ernie Perilli. The first page contained the reminder that ten years had passed since the last District title and a challenge to match that goal. The “Zack/Zach Attack” of seniors Zack Montijo and Zach Hoagland made it their mission to bring the team together and complete the summer workout program. Along the way they picked up a soccer player, Brad Miles, and a basketball player, Dom Camasso. Rounding out the varsity would be returning Juniors Brian Kuntzmann, Brian Quintrell, and Tim Stauring. Most of these runners knew what training would be like having been with Coach Perilli in Winter Track and Coach Jaros in Spring Track. And so, it began.

The September 29th posting of PennTrackXC.com gave an ominous warning to cross country teams in Pennsylvania. It stated “Ignore North Penn at your own risk this year. A track power excels at cross, too.” That statement was considerably different from how North Penn was seen at the beginning of the 2007 season. In the August 15th pre-season report, we weren’t listed in the top ten Northeastern U. S. Boy’s teams. We weren’t even listed as one of the ten next bubble teams. We were on no one’s radar and with good reason. In 2006 we finished 14th in the District 1 XC Championship and our only two runners who made it to states finished in 33rd, 74th places. But, by the third week, North Penn had jumped to eighth in the Northeast after a crushing win at Briarwood and 63 points over second place. Zach Hoagland placed 2nd but beat the old meet record. In week four we jumped to fifth place in the Northeast by virtue of a 28 point win at Carlisle. The 60 point win at the Salesianum Invitational, with five North Penn runners placing in the top 11, moved us into 4th place in week five. Zach Hoagland finished 1st and recorded the 4th best time ever on the course. The Manhattan Invitational in week six came next. North Penn boys won the “D” race upsetting the second best team in the Southeast by a score of 44 to 98 and, with well over a thousand schools competing, won the top team of the meet watches with the best team time of the day and the second best team average time in the history of the meet. The Knights 12:58.0 was the only sub-13 in the meet. We moved to first place in the Northeast rankings.

Scoring in Cross Country is different from most sports in that the lowest score wins. The best achievable score is 15, if your runners place 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th. If you also get 6th and 7th the best score your opponent can have is 50. (Only the first seven runners count). In dual meet competition North Penn won ten of eleven meets with a score of 15. Six opponents had scores of 50, two had scores of 49, one of 48, one of 47, and one of 43.

At the Suburban 1 National League Championship Meet, North Penn placed first with 19 points with the second place team scoring 69. Finishing in the top 10 were Zack Montijo 1st, Brad Miles 2nd, Zach Hoagland 3rd, Dom Comasso 6th, Brian Quintrell 7th, and Tim Stauring 8th. Awarded first team all-league were Zack Montijo, Brad Miles, and Zach Hoagland, second team all-league were Brian Quintrell, Dom Camasso, and Brian Kuntzmann, and third team all-league was Tim Stauring.

At the PIAA District One meet North Penn placed first with 92 points, 78 points ahead of second place. Scoring for the Knights were Brad Miles 4th, Zack Montijo 6th, Zach Hoagland 16th, Brian Quintrell 30th, and Tim Stauring 36th (with at time spread of 40 seconds).

The PIAA State Cross Country course would be something different for most of our runners since only Zach and Zack had been there previous year. There were long steep hills both up and down with hard turns and flat sprints but the Knights put another first place into the record book. Our 90 points was the only team score under 100 and the 2007 Team became the first North Penn Cross Country State Champions – Boys or Girls. State Meet scoring (team place/meet place) was Zack Montijo (1st team All-State) 1st/6th; Brad Miles (2nd team All-State and the second fastest underclassman of the meet) 3rd/10th, Zach Hoagland 12th/24th, Tim Stauring 28th/61st; Dom Camasso 46th/101st; Brian “Quintrell 62nd/124th; and Brian Kuntzmann 67th/135th. Zack Montijo was named to the first team All-State with Brad Miles being named to the second team All-State. Coach Jaros was named PIAA 2007 Cross Country Coach of the Year.

At the end of the season the North Penn Boys Cross Country team was ranked first in the State and Northeast and seventh in the Nation. In the final week edition of the PennTrackXC.com Cross Country coverage the headline read “No one picked North Penn, except North Penn.”

The Difference between "Yeah and Yes"

The 2008 Indoor Track season was shrouded in mystery as the cold Pennsylvania winter arrived. The North Penn Knights had long relied on their senior leadership for experience and strong results; however, this was a team subjected to the entire turnover inherent to a high school varsity teams. They would have to rely on their depth like never before in order to reach or even surpass the heights achieved by so many before them. Adorned with the successes of their 2006 State Championship, third-year coaches Jaimey Jones, Jonathan Fluck, and Ernie Perilli were now charged with the task of turning their team into a storied program.

As the elements of winter forced the team inside, the coaches made sure that their athletes were ready to weather any storm. No matter the circumstance, Coach Jones demanded the most out of each workout. There was a simple message threading this campaign together: the answer was always "yes not yeah". "Yeah" was taking a snowy day off. "Yes" was meeting teammates for a work out on News Years Day. "Yes" was leading the coldest workout of the season. "Yes" was taking responsibility for your team and holding other accountable for their contributions to the team. Soon enough, the coaches were seeing their messages and practice permeate the psyche of the team. Everyone began to see this transformation on the tracks of Glen Mills, Ursinus College, Lehigh University and, come February, Penn State University.

The stage was then set for eleven athletes to represent North Penn High School on Penn State's Ashenfelter track facility. Of those eleven athletes, six were under classmen. Once again, if the knights were going to achieve the standard of success at the State meet that they were used to, they were going to have to rely on the leadership and depth that got them there. The trio of seniors Zack Montijo, Justin Bookheimer, and Steve Franks turned in a strong showing for the Knights taking 2nd, 5th, and 6th respectively in the 800 meter run. This trio later combined with Brian Quintrell to turn in a gold medal performance for the 4X800m relay. The relay team set new state record in the process. An inspired performance by Mike Joell, Alex Hill, Ronnie Akins and Abu Siddique earned them a 5th place medal in the 4X200m relay. With the coaching of Mitch Cashatt, Sean Gentry was quietly turning in outstanding personal performances to earn him 4th in the high jump and 6th in the triple jump. Entering the final event of the day, the Knights were not going to leave anything up to chance. Mike Joell, Alex Hill, Zack Montijo, and Justin Bookheimer sealed the state championship with a 2nd place finish in the 4X400m relay. The attitude and commitment had paid off for the program once again in winning the 2008 Indoor State Championship.

With the continued support of the coaching staff, the 4X800m relay team went on to win The National Scholastic Indoor Championship title at the Armory Track in New York City. The time turned in by the 4X800m relay was the #1 in the United States..

The trophies and medals continue to stand as a testament to the valiant performances and feats of strength shown by both athletes and coaches alike. Far beyond those markers of success, the lessons of discipline and leadership continue to serve every member of that team. In the end the North Penn Knights were too strong to be beaten and the tradition continued.

2008 Cross Country Team PIAA State Champions

“Underdog North Penn claims back-to-back PA State Crowns.”

How did the team with five of their top seven runners returning for the 2008 season become the underdog at the state meet? It started with the fact that they were the defending PIAA State Cross Country Champions. Secondly, from 1939 through 2007 in PIAA history, there have only been four school districts in Pennsylvania that have had back-to-back Cross Country State Championships. No pressure there. We started the official season practice having gone through the same summer workout packet as last year. The guys were in great shape but were putting a lot of pressure on themselves by looking too far ahead. As Brian Kuntzmann put it “...we just felt the pressure trying to keep up with last year’s team and trying to make it happen again this year.” The one point loss at the Briarwood Invitational ate away at their confidence, even if it was to the number three ranked team in the Nation. The Knights were winning dual meets but not with the crushing shutouts of the previous year. Then came the 56 to 109 loss at the Carlisle Invitational to North Allegheny. Talk about being tight as a drum!

The turnaround came at a practice when we started to realize they were hitting the same workout times as last year and that the only difference was the mental side in races. That understanding showed in the next invitational. At Salesianum, North Penn scored a big win over teams from Pennsylvania, Delaware, New Jersey, and Maryland and lead runner Brad Miles ran the third fastest time in the history of the meet. We followed that up with another big win at the Manhattan Invitational. The Knights won their section race by placing runners Brad Miles in 1st, Brian Quintrell in 2nd, Tim Stauring in 3rd, Sam Bernitt in 4th, Dom Camasso in 9th, and Brian Kuntzmann in 12th —the second best team time of the day. Their 13:04.23 was just a few seconds off of last year’s. We were back and ready for the championships.

North Penn won their League meet with 45 points with Brad Miles in 1st, Sam Bernitt in 4th, Brian Quintrell in 7th, Dom Camasso in 14th, Brian Kuntzman in 19th, and Tim Stauring in 32nd. At the District One Championships, Brad was 6th, Sam was 7th, Brian Quintrell was 11th, Tim placed 38th, and Dom was 48th, with Brain Kuntzmann 51st.

The PIAA State Cross Country Championships were now in front of us. As one reporter put it, North Penn “...has undergone a complete metamorphosis since that late September afternoon.” She went on to describe the relaxed mood of our team and how that should be “the first indication that the rest of the state could be in trouble.” She continued “when a team with the combination of talent and historical success that North Penn possess is relaxed, there is no telling what might happen.” The Knights, ranked 13th in the MileSplit National poll, defended its PIAA title. North Penn finished with a 49 second split between its 1st and 5th runners and a team score of 92. For the second year in a row, North Penn was the only team to score under 100 points. The final team and individual placings for the state meet were as follows – Brad Miles 3rd/7th, Sam Bernitt 5th/10th, Brian Quintrell 18th/31st, Tim Stauring 27th/49th, Brian Kuntzmann 39th/69th, Dom Camasso 59th/118th, and Alex Dello Buono 128th/235th.

Many consider the District 1 Championship the most difficult in the State from which to advance and a preview of the State meet. The five state qualifying teams from District 1 finished in the top seven teams in the State meet and four of these teams are from Suburban One.

North Penn Cross Country finished its second undefeated season in a row, its first back-to-back PIAA State Championships, and another League and District 1 title.

The end of the year awards were as follows – Brad Miles -team MVP, team High Scorer, 1st Team All-State & 1st team All –League; Sam Bernitt- Rookie of the Year, 2nd team All-State & 1st team All-League; Brian Quintrell – Outstanding Senior, 1st team All-League; Dom Camasso – Coaches Award, 2nd team All-League; Brian Kuntzman – Clutch Race Award, 3rd team All-League; Tim Stauring – Coaches Award, Honorable Mention All-League; Alex DelloBuono – Outstanding Sophomore. Coaches Jaros and Perilli congratulate the entire North Penn Cross Country team on a great season.

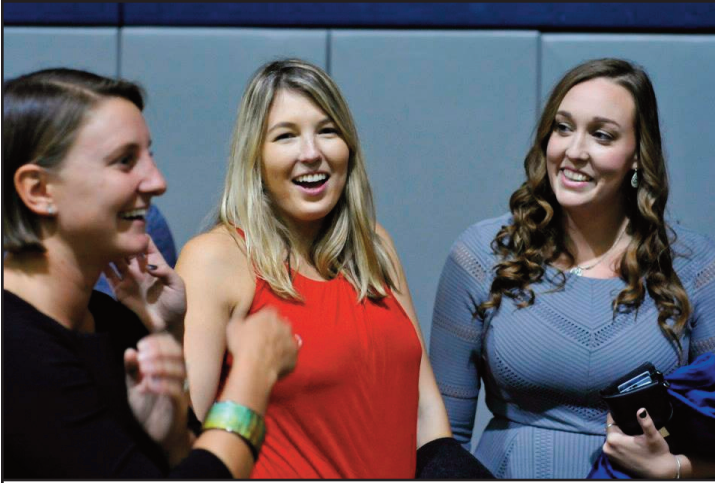

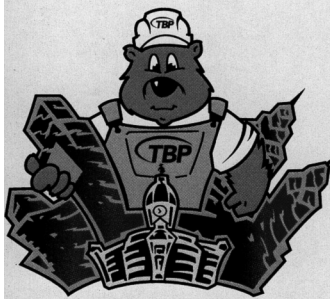

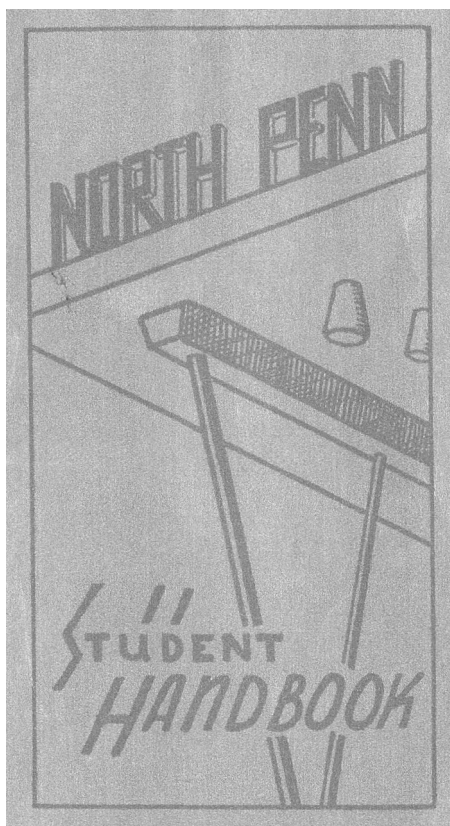
