### **Andy Kusma Memorial Award**

Andy's sports career started when he was a shy, young boy in New Jersey playing little league baseball. After relocating to Pennsylvania as a fourth grader, Andy discovered sports as a positive way of interacting with others. Sports would continue to shape his life and the person he became. Andy found positive influences from coaches throughout his sports career and looked to them for guidance.

This scholarship was created by Andy's friends and family with the help of the NPAAA, to help keep his memory and dedication to sports alive, after losing his battle with pancreatic cancer on December 25, 2007. Andy understood the importance of a college education, and the struggle many families have with the growing cost of tuition. It was his dream to be able to reward the athletes of North Penn Athletics, by allowing them the opportunity to continue their athletic careers while receiving a college education.

In 2008, the North Penn Athletic Alumni Association presented 3 male athletes with the first scholarship in the name of Andy Kusma. The Andy Kusma Scholarship Fund has continued to grow since then, through in-kind donations and proceeds from the Andy Kusma Memorial Golf Tournament, now in its second year.

#### A History of the North Penn School System


The roots of public education in the North Penn area predate the Civil War when simple one-room schoolhouses dotted the countryside. They offered schooling at the most basic level because all the primary grades were taught by a single teacher in that one-room environment. Students who wanted "higher" education had to travel to a town where advanced courses were available. As villages grew into larger boroughs in the 1880s, 12-year diploma programs were offered in these schools, and senior classes evolved – some with as few as a single student.

Lansdale School District was formed in 1871, a year before the community became an incorporated borough. In 1872, its first public school was built on East Main Street. The first graduating class in 1888 consisted of four students. The original school on Main Street was replaced by the larger Broad Street and Green Street schools in 1888 and 1899, respectively, but it was not until 1914 that the first Lansdale High School was built. An influx of new industries and affordable residential housing quickly pushed the high school building past capacity, and in 1930 the school board agreed to build a new high school on Penn Street, where there would be plenty of room for future expansion. Because of this foresight, the second Lansdale High School stood the test of time much better than its predecessor. Over a period of 40 years, the campus grew to serve a total of seven towns and townships in the region. When regional consolidation took place in 1955, the Penn Street school underwent a massive expansion project that more than doubled the size of the original school. In June 1955, the final Lansdale High School diplomas were awarded, and three months later North Penn High School was born.

Like Lansdale, Hatfield's education system evolved from one-room schools into a larger school that began offering advanced grades during the 1890s. Hatfield Consolidated School District was formed in 1921 when residents of the borough and township agreed to erect a modern high school on the boroughtownship line in 1921. The new facility contained 19 rooms and was built on a 10 1/2-acre tract at Fairgrounds and Cowpath Roads. When the building opened in September 1922, it was the first six-year high school in this part of the state. A total of 492 students were brought together under the same roof, taught by a 15-member faculty. Hatfield High featured the largest auditorium and gymnasium between Philadelphia and the Lehigh Valley. Now the home of the Biblical Theological Seminary, Hatfield High School's last graduates received their diplomas in 1955. The high school closed its doors on June 10, 1955, and in September, 1955, Hatfield's underclassmen began attending the North Penn Joint High School in Lansdale.


Public education in North Wales also began with a one-room school located on Main Street that was built before the town was incorporated in 1869. The bustling young town soon outgrew its first schoolhouse and a new one was erected at Third and School Sts. By the 1890s that structure also proved inadequate and a three-story addition was built to house all 12 grades. North Wales held its first commencement in 1887 – with one student receiving a diploma. The School Street building was replaced in 1928 by what is now North Wales Elementary School on Summit Street. Like Lansdale and Hatfield, North Wales became a part of the North Penn Jointure in 1955, ending the era of independent school districts – and high schools – in each town.


To come full circle, the post-World War II construction boom impacted the once rural townships of Hatfield, Montgomery, Upper Gwynedd and Towamencin much like the rapid growth the borough experienced a half-century earlier. The venerable Lansdale/North Penn High School was no longer able to contain the influx of new students. In 1971 a new, massive high school campus was built in Towamencin, and Penn Street was converted into what is now Penndale Middle School.




















The History of the North Penn Alumni Athletic Association Two Hall of Fames By Thomas F. Strickland Jr., President NPAAA, October 11, 2014

The NPAAA was founded in the year 2000 with a mission to uphold the standards and prestige of the North Penn High School athletic program and to encourage and promote higher education through scholarship awards to those student athletes who demonstrate courage and sacrifice during their athletic careers. The NPAAA expanded its mission in 2004 when a decision was made by the Board of Directors to establish a sports Hall of Fame to recognize those alumni from North Penn High School and its legacy schools who best exemplified those high standards while participating in athletics in the high school.

After the NPAAA voted to initiate an athletic Hall of Fame, the Board of Directors proceeded with defining its vision. First, the NPAAA had to establish a qualification criteria and organizational guidelines to provide a systematic methodology for selecting inductees. Once that was established, the NPAAA created three committees: one to research, prioritize and select the inductees; a second to determine appropriate inductee awards and method of recognition; and a third to initiate a fundraising campaign to provide the monies necessary to support the NPAAA's dual mission of scholarship awards and athletic recognition.

The mission of the NPAAA is sustained by a desire to provide future generations with a historical record of the outstanding student athletes and teams representing North Penn High School and its legacy schools (Hatfield High School, Lansdale High School, and North Wales High School). This history, which provides both a source of pride and a standard to emulate, dates back to 1887.

On October 8, 2005, the NPAAA hosted its Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony at North Penn High School. Fifty two athletes (spanning eight decades) and one team were inducted. The ceremony was attended by several hundred people and included the enthusiastic endorsement and participation of North Penn School District Officials. A program was provided that included the history of the schools, a history of the team inducted, and profiles of the inducted athletes. An announcement was made at this event about plans to establish a permanent Hall of Fame Wall in North Penn High School. This initiative was presented to North Penn High School Officials and was enthusiastically approved.

A fundraising campaign was initiated immediately following the Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Event and by Mid-August 2006, the NPAAA raised sufficient funding to proceed with the creation of the

Hall of Fame Wall. A vendor was selected to provide the raised metal plaques that would be installed on the Wall of Fame in North Penn High School.


In addition, The North Penn Alumni Athletic Association, as part of its Sports Hall of Fame mission, gives Special Recognition to teams that did not achieve PIAA State Championship level, but won league a championship along with other NPHS league championship teams in any given year; or a team(s) that in the opinion of the NPAAA Board of Directors should be recognized for their unique contribution to North Penn High School sports history.

Three special recognition plaques have been installed on the Wall of Honor. On May 16, 2011, the NPAAA Board of Directors again approved the expansion of its current mission of providing scholarships to senior student athletes and the creation of the Sports Hall of Fame, to establishing a "Lifetime Achievement Hall of Fame" to be installed in North Penn High School. The NPAAA has expanded its mission to honor North Penn High School and Legacy School graduates who have made significant contributions to society in the Arts, Business, Education, Legal, Medical, Performing Arts, Public Service, or the Sciences fields of endeavor.

This initiative was presented to, and approved by, the North Penn School District Superintendent and North Penn High School Principal. The NPAAA has been provided a wall at North Penn High School (separate from the Athletic Wall of Honor) to display inductee profile plaques. This year (2014) we are inducting our fourth Lifetime Achievement award winner.

Since 2005 and including the Event on October 10, 2015 we have installed 140 plaques for the individual athletes, 31 team plaques, 5 Lifetime Achievement plaques, and 5 special recognition plaques on the Halls of Fame Walls of Honor.

# WILLIAM SCOTT MOYER North Penn High School, 1981


In 1989, Scott reported to NAS Miramar CA where he flew the F-14 Tomcat and completed two deployments aboard the USS Ranger, flying 42 combat missions in support of Operations Desert Storm and Southern Watch over Iraq.

As a member of the Blue Angels Scott was an ambassador representing the United States Navy and the Armed Forces visiting Children's Hospitals, VA hospitals, High Schools and College ROTC units. Traveling over 300 days a year, he provided inspiration and motivation to many around the country and the world. Following his tour with the Blue Angels, he returned to the fleet and deployed aboard the USS Roosevelt. He was personally chosen to lead the Navy's first strike into Kosovo in support of Operation Allied Force. Under heavy fire he successfully led a 24 aircraft strike and was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross with Combat Valor. He was selected as the 1999 Atlantic Fleet Fighter Pilot of the Year.

Scott was promoted to Commander and assumed command of Fighter Squadron Eleven in 2002 aboard the USS George Washington. He flew missions in support of Operation Enduring Freedom and Fallugah. 

He was a member of both the highly accomplished Swimming and Water Polo Teams from 1996-1999, lettering in 7 seasons between the two sports. Amazingly, of those seven seasons, four were State Titles and two were State Runner- Ups. During his time on the swim team Jeremy was an instrumental part of the 3 State titles and 1 State runner- up. As a member of the of the Water Polo Team, Jeremy lettered on the State Championship team of 1996 and was the MVP of the State Runner-Up team of 1999.

While swimming at North Penn, Jeremy was a State qualifier all four years in the 200 freestyle, culminating with a PIAA State Individual Title in his marquee event in 1999. He earned State Titles in the 400 Freestyle Relay in 1997 and 1999, and a 200 Freestyle Relay State Title in 1997. Jeremy's career also included two district titles in the 200 free in 1998 and 1999. Jeremy was named team MVP in swimming his senior year and finished his career as a eight time All American.

As a member of the water polo team, despite a 2 year stint as a goalie, Jeremy would eventually move to the Offensive 2 meter position where he would find his way to a 90 goal season his senior year, and hit a sudden death quintuple overtime goal to send the team to the State Championship Game, which despite losing was quite the accomplishment for that team. Jeremy was named team MVP in his senior season for water polo as well and was a 4th Team All American.

After North Penn, Jeremy accepted a Division I scholarship to swim at James Madison University, and despite having three different coaches in the three years that he swam, he was a multi event finalist every year at JMU's conference championships. JMU was the champion of the Colonial Athletic Conference all three of those years and Jeremy earned All-Conference in his freestyle events and relays during that time. Despite choosing not swim for his fourth year of eligibility, Jeremy did lead the JMU men's club water polo club during that season to its highest ever finish in the Middle Atlantic Water Polo Association with a runner up at the Conference Championships.



Steve Fleming is honored to be part of the 2016 class of inductees being elected into the North Penn Athletic Hall of Fame. During his time at North Penn, Steve was fortunate to be teamed up with a talented group of swimmers, water polo players and coaches. The Class of 2000 is the only NP class to win 4 straight State Swimming Championships, never losing a dual, District or State meets during their tenure. The 1999 and 2000 seasons brought national attention, ranking North Penn as one of the best public high school teams in the US including a national championship in 2000. In addition to swimming, Steve also participated on the water polo team where North Penn consistently ranked as a top team in the state, including a runner-up finish in 1998.

Individually, Steve played an integral role in the swim team's success. His junior year, he won state championships in the 100 yard backstroke and 400 yard Free Relay, including the school record in the 100 back. His senior year, he won in the 200 yard Medley Relay and placed 2nd in the 100 yard backstroke and 400 yard Free Relay. What's most important to Steve, during this period, was being selected captain of both the swimming and water polo teams while performing in and out of the pool – he was selected as an athletic and academic All-American multiple times.

Upon graduation from North Penn in 2000, Steve swam at Princeton University. He was a member of the 2002 and 2004 Ivy League Championship teams and held the school records in the 200 yard backstroke and 400 yard Medley Relay. In 2003, he qualified for the Division I NCAA championship meet. In 2004, Steve graduated with an undergraduate degree in Economics.

After graduating with honors from Princeton, Steve joined Trinity Partners LLC in Boston, a healthcare consulting company. He has been with Trinity for 12 years where he is now a Partner and member of their leadership team. He has helped grow the small, boutique firm from ~35 employees to 150 today. 
As an athlete at North Penn, Jim was fortunate to participate in three sports; golf, basketball and track, earning his first varsity letter as a 9th grader in golf. The following year, in addition to golf, Jim played JV basketball and earned his first letter in track and field. For his efforts, Jim was named the Knights' Male Sophomore Athlete of the Year.

Jim began excelling in athletics as a junior and earned letters in all three sports. But it was in track and field where Jim was most successful. In 1983, Jim helped his team to a Bux-Mont Championship finishing 2nd in the 110m high hurdles and earning all-Bux Mont honors in the high jump and triple jump. He went on to finish second in the District 1 high hurdles and qualified for the state championship in the triple jump as well. He finished 7th in the state in both events. That year he was one of only four North Penn athletes to qualify for the state championship and the only athlete to qualify in two events.

Jim focused on basketball and track in his senior year. As a starter in every game that season, Jim helped North Penn score one of the basketball program's biggest upsets when the Knights defeated topranked Lower Merion on the Aces' home court in the first round of the District 1 tournament.

That spring Jim was named captain of the track team and led the Knights to a pair of team titles. First, Jim captured the high hurdles and triple jump championships, and earned all-Bux-Mont honors in the long jump and high jump to help North Penn win the Bux-Mont title. He then won the District 1 championship in the high hurdles, placed 3rd in the triple jump and 6th in the intermediate hurdles as the Knights captured the District 1 team title. He completed his career by finishing 2nd and earning all-State honors in the 110m high hurdles while leading North Penn to a 4th place finish overall at the PIAA State Championship. Following the season, Jim was named the Knight's MVP.



Bill started his North Penn swimming career in his sophomore year in 1972-73. The Knights were in their second year of competition where he made an immediate impact, helping the team to its first 10- win season and first Bux-Mont League Championship. The North Penn team entered District One Swimming and Diving Championships with hopes of a strong showing and finished seventh. Individually, Bill placed in the top three at the Bux-Mont League Championships in two events, placed third in both the 100 Butterfly and 100 Breaststroke at the District One Championships, and, as the team's sole representative at the PIAA State Swimming & Diving Championships, finished 10th in both the 100 Butterfly and 100 Breaststroke. He earned All-State honors, was the team MVP, and earned Sophomore Athlete of the Year honors.

During the 1973-74 year, the Knights swim team laid the foundation for success by completing their first undefeated season (13-0), winning their second straight Bux-Mont League Championship, and first ever District One Team Championship. Bill was League Champion in two events, District Champion in the 100 Breaststroke and 200 Medley Relay, and finished third in the 100 Butterfly. He earned his second trip to the PIAA State Swimming Championship where he placed seventh in the 100 Breaststroke and eighth in the 100 Butterfly, and earned All-State honors in both.

In Bill's senior year, 1974-75, the team refused to rest on prior success and accomplishments, and set upon a path that would lead them into the record books. The team finished 13-0, won the league championship for the third straight year, and won the District crown for the second straight year. Bill won two individual events at the League Championships, and finished second in the 100 Breaststroke and fourth in the 200 Individual Medley (IM) at the District One Championships. His performance earned him his third trip to States, where he finished fifth in the 200 IM, seventh in the 100 Breaststroke, and first in the 400 Freestyle Relay along with Bruce Seaman, Bill Muller, and Tony Bartle, which set a new state record time of 3:14.75. The 400 Free Relay performance at the State meet earned All-America honors, the first North Penn Swimming relay team to receive this honor. Bill earned All-State honors for his performance in his two individual events. Rick Carroll coached the Knights to the 1975 PIAA State Swimming Championship Team title for the first time in the school's history and started the legacy that North Penn Swimming is today.

When Bill's high school swimming career ended, he was Bux-Mont League Champion in six events, District Champion in the 100 Breaststroke and 200 Medley Relay, and State Champion in the 400 Free Relay. His versatility allowed him to compete in multiple events, and he established five team records (3 individuals and 2 relay) during his three years at North Penn. Bill was the first three-time state championship qualifier from North Penn. Bill was also a member of the National Honor Society.

Bill was awarded a swimming scholarship to the University of Pittsburgh, where his team won four straight Big East Team Championships. He earned four varsity letters, All-Big East honors 1976 through 1978, and consistently placed in the top six in the 200 Butterfly and 200/400 IM. In 1979, Bill graduated Cum Laude with a B.S. in Health and Physical Education.

After graduating from Pitt, Bill taught in the suburban Pittsburgh area where he coached high school and club swimming. After returning to the North Penn area in 1982, Bill began coaching with the North Penn Aquatic Club, leading the Girls and Boys teams to 9 Suburban Aquatic League (SAL) Championships. During his coaching career with NPAC, five of his swimmers attained the Nation Age Group (NAG) Top 16 designation as one of the fastest 16 age group swimmers in the nation.

Bill is married to Cathy Lampitoc Moser, a standout athlete in her own right. They live in Upper Gwynedd where they raised three children, Alissa, Gavin and Andrea, each of whom graduated from North Penn High School and live in the area. Bill joins his daughter, Alissa, who received Hall of Fame honors in October 2009. Bill and Cathy are looking forward to seeing their three grandchildren, Madelyn, Isabelle, and Connor compete for North Penn. Bill is the Chief Human Resources Officer for a national company based in New Jersey.

Jim still ranks as one of the all-time North Penn track and field performers with four marks in the school's top-10 performances: high hurdles – 3rd, long jump – 7th, high jump – 7th and triple jump – 8th.

Following his North Penn career, Jim earned a scholarship to La Salle University where he was a four year letter winner in track and field. He remains the school record holder in the Decathlon and Pentathlon and once held the 55m high hurdle record. He was a 5-time IC4A qualifier and 2-time conference champion. Jim earned a B.A. in Economics from La Salle in 1989.

Following graduation, Jim served 11 years at the U. S. # 1976 SWIMMING TEAM PA STATE CHAMPIONS Back to Back State Champions



The 1976 Swimming and Diving Team was undefeated in 14 dual meets raising the undefeated streak to 40 consecutive wins. This team won the Bux-Mont League for the 4th consecutive year, the District 1 Championship for the 3rd consecutive year and was recognized by the National Interscholastic Swim Coaches Association as the Pennsylvania State Swim Team Champions. Their domination included winning every event in the Central Bucks and Wilson Relays and winning the York Suburban Xmas Invitational Dual Meet Tournament.

The 1976 Swim Team will be remembered not only because they won back to back state championships, but also because of the traumatic and dramatic way that they went about accomplishing that feat. The traumatic part began in the District 1 Championship Meet, during the final event, the 4x100 freestyle relay. North Penn had already secured the District 1 title, and the relay team was very cautious on their take-offs to avoid a false start leading to a team disqualification. Richard Schlecht led off the relay and touched with a slight lead. Brother R. J. was second and was increasing the lead as he approached the final turn. Unknown to anyone, he swallowed a mouthful of water. Being an experienced swimmer, he attempted to expel the water as he executed the turn. Trouble mounted as he came out of the turn. R. J. stopped; doggie paddled, coughed and choked then took a few strokes with his head up high and struggling as all the other swimmers passed him. Drowning was a possibility, but his inner determination and knowledge that his team was depending on him, gave him incentive to finish. He also knew if he didn't finish his older brother would have killed him. R. J. was literally pulled out of the pool by his brother and Bill Muller, the anchor swimmer. Bill Bartle, swimmer number 3 took off, now in last place, as the paramedics began resuscitating R. J. Knowing that only the top 2 finishers would qualify for the state meet, Bill Bartle and Bill Muller pulled off absolutely the most dramatic comeback possible. Stroke by stroke they swam back into contention and by some miracle touched first, OFF TO PENN STATE FOR THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP MEET

At the state meet Bill Muller won the 50 Freestyle in a huge upset and placed 2nd in the 100 Freestyle. Bill Bartle placed 2nd in the Individual Medley and 9th in the 500 freestyle while Joel Gaskin was 3rd in the Diving. Richard Schlecht placed 10th in the 200 Freestyle and R. J. Schlecht placed 7th in the Individual Medley and 6th in the 500 Freestyle. It all came down to the final event. Needing a first place finish the 4x100 FREESTYLE RELAY TEAM of Captain RICHARD SCHLECHT, R. J. SCHLECHT, BILL BARTLE AND BILL MULLER not only won the Gold Medal but set a STATE RECORD

# North Penn Baseball – 2009 State Championship team "The worst seat in the house"



The 2008 season ended with a heartbreaking loss. Ahead 5-0 in the last inning in the State tournament opener, The Knights lost in extra innings. A talented group of seniors and underclassmen were expected to do very well in the District and State playoffs. The District Championship showed that those expectations were not a fluke. The first round loss crushed the hopes of the school's first state title. Often the coach has the worst seat in the house. When his team spirals, sometimes there is no bringing them back. It is a tough thing to see and an even tougher thing to think about during the entire off-season.

The 2009 squad had a lot to prove. Clearly, everyone expected the Knights to be competitive once again but many probably had doubts as to whether North Penn could ever cross that barrier and dominate at the State level like they had done for a long time at the local level. The talent was once again there – Eric Ruth and Mike Bradstreet on the mound, Robbie Zinsmeister, Scott Christy, Matt Albaugh, Jimmy Smith, Craig Lepre, and others in the infield, Justin Davey, Christian Radick, and Jake Dunn in the outfield, and several others to fill in any gaps – but would they put it all together and win when it counted the most?

A strategic plan was created to do less coaching. Sometimes the key to having a talented team is to just get out of the way and let them play. Since the dugout is often the worst seat in the house, players were encouraged to look around and see things on the field that the coaches could not and act on it independently. We decided to get away from the scoreboard and focus more on performance goals. Our first scrimmage showed we might be on to something special. One of our goals for the game was to have 6 stolen base attempts that were player initiated and not called for by any coach. The base runners were totally on their own. With one out in the first inning we already had our six stolen bases.

When games started, the boys had trouble finding themselves in this new system and got off to an inconsistent start which included a three game losing streak. We gave them room to find and make the necessary adjustments. It took time and our league record suffered a little but we still managed to finish our conference in second place and get the final seed in the District Playoffs. Losing to West Chester East in the quarterfinals put the Knights in the District losers bracket where the Knights won the next two games to finish 5th in the District which earned them the last bid into the State tournament.

From there the Knights exploded by running the table, beating powerhouses Chambersburg, Council Rock North, North Allegheny, and finally Parkland to win the school's first baseball State Championship. Our pitching and defense gave up only three runs the entire tournament with dominant pitching by Eric Ruth and Mike Bradstreet.

When the final out was made on a line drive to Scott Christy, North Penn had finally crossed the barrier. They were the school's first baseball State Champions and the coaching staff and community could not have been more proud.




