Andy Kusma Memorial Award

Andy's sports career started when he was a shy, young boy in New Jersey playing little league baseball. After relocating to Pennsylvania as a fourth grader, Andy discovered sports as a positive way of interacting with others. Sports would continue to shape his life and the person he became. Andy found positive influences from coaches throughout his sports career and looked to them for guidance.

This scholarship was created by Andy's friends and family with the help of the NPAAA, to help keep his memory and dedication to sports alive, after losing his battle with pancreatic cancer on December 25, 2007. Andy understood the importance of a college education, and the struggle many families have with the growing cost of tuition. It was his dream to be able to reward the athletes of North Penn Athletics, by allowing them the opportunity to continue their athletic careers while receiving a college education.

In 2008, the North Penn Athletic Alumni Association presented 3 male athletes with the first scholarship in the name of Andy Kusma. The Andy Kusma Scholarship Fund has continued to grow since then, through in-kind donations and proceeds from the Andy Kusma Memorial Golf Tournament, now in its second year.

A History of the North Penn School System

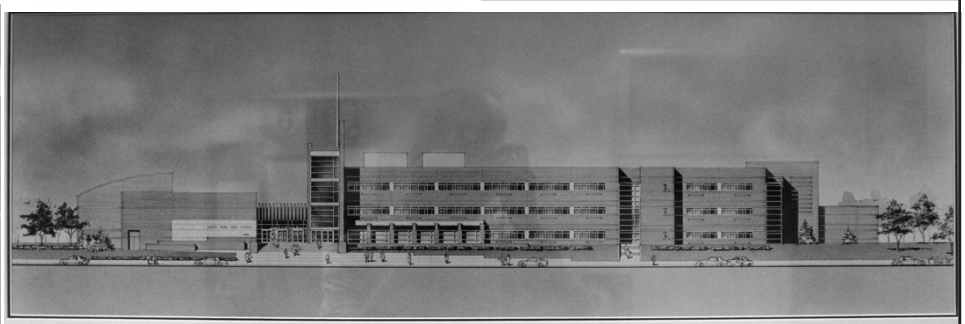
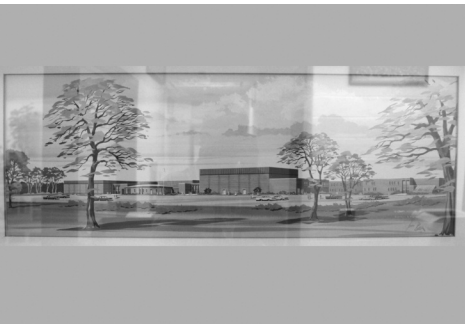
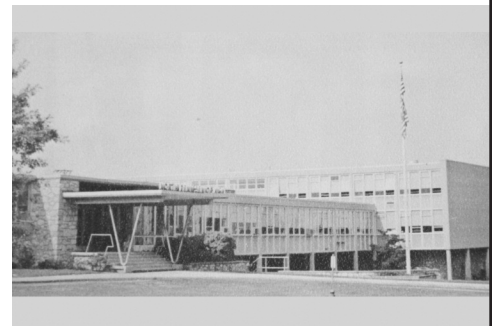
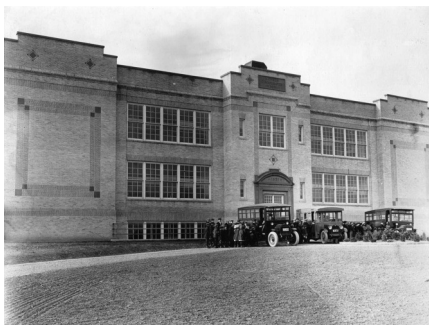
The roots of public education in the North Penn area predate the Civil War when simple one-room schoolhouses dotted the countryside. They offered schooling at the most basic level because all the primary grades were taught by a single teacher in that one-room environment. Students who wanted "higher" education had to travel to a town where advanced courses were available. As villages grew into larger boroughs in the 1880s, 12-year diploma programs were offered in these schools, and senior classes evolved – some with as few as a single student.

Lansdale School District was formed in 1871, a year before the community became an incorporated borough. In 1872, its first public school was built on East Main Street. The first graduating class in 1888 consisted of four students. The original school on Main Street was replaced by the larger Broad Street and Green Street schools in 1888 and 1899, respectively, but it was not until 1914 that the first Lansdale High School was built. An influx of new industries and affordable residential housing quickly pushed the high school building past capacity, and in 1930 the school board agreed to build a new high school on Penn Street, where there would be plenty of room for future expansion. Because of this foresight, the second Lansdale High School stood the test of time much better than its predecessor. Over a period of 40 years, the campus grew to serve a total of seven towns and townships in the region. When regional consolidation took place in 1955, the Penn Street school underwent a massive expansion project that more than doubled the size of the original school. In June 1955, the final Lansdale High School diplomas were awarded, and three months later North Penn High School was born.

Like Lansdale, Hatfield's education system evolved from one-room schools into a larger school that began offering advanced grades during the 1890s. Hatfield Consolidated School District was formed in 1921 when residents of the borough and township agreed to erect a modern high school on the borough-township line in 1921. The new facility contained 19 rooms and was built on a 10 1/2-acre tract at Fairgrounds and Cowpath Roads. When the building opened in September 1922, it was the first six-year high school in this part of the state. A total of 492 students were brought together under the same roof, taught by a 15-member faculty. Hatfield High featured the largest auditorium and gymnasium between Philadelphia and the Lehigh Valley. Now the home of the Biblical Theological Seminary, Hatfield High School's last graduates received their diplomas in 1955. The high school closed its doors on June 10, 1955, and in September, 1955, Hatfield's underclassmen began attending the North Penn Joint High School in Lansdale.

Public education in North Wales also began with a one-room school located on Main Street that was built before the town was incorporated in 1869. The bustling young town soon outgrew its first schoolhouse and a new one was erected at Third and School Sts. By the 1890s that structure also proved inadequate and a three-story addition was built to house all 12 grades. North Wales held its first commencement in 1887 – with one student receiving a diploma. The School Street building was replaced in 1928 by what is now North Wales Elementary School on Summit Street. Like Lansdale and Hatfield, North Wales became a part of the North Penn Jointure in 1955, ending the era of independent school districts – and high schools – in each town.

To come full circle, the post-World War II construction boom impacted the once rural townships of Hatfield, Montgomery, Upper Gwynedd and Towamencin much like the rapid growth the borough experienced a half-century earlier. The venerable Lansdale/North Penn High School was no longer able to contain the influx of new students. In 1971 a new, massive high school campus was built in Towamencin, and Penn Street was converted into what is now Penndale Middle School.





The History of the North Penn Alumni Athletic Association Two Hall of Fames **By Thomas F. Strickland Jr., President NPAAA, October 6, 2018**

The NPAAA was founded in the year 2000 with a mission to uphold the standards and prestige of the North Penn High School athletic program and to encourage and promote higher education through scholarship awards to those student athletes who demonstrate courage and sacrifice during their athletic careers.

The NPAAA expanded its mission in 2004 when a decision was made by the Board of Directors to establish a sports Hall of Fame to recognize those alumni from North Penn High School and its legacy schools who best exemplified those high standards while participating in athletics in the high school.

After the NPAAA voted to initiate an athletic Hall of Fame, the Board of Directors proceeded with defining its vision. First, the NPAAA had to establish a qualification criteria and organizational guidelines to provide a systematic methodology for selecting inductees. Once that was established, the NPAAA created three committees: one to research, prioritize and select the inductees; a second to determine appropriate inductee awards and method of recognition; and a third to initiate a fundraising campaign to provide the monies necessary to support the NPAAA's dual mission of scholarship awards and athletic recognition.

The mission of the NPAAA is sustained by a desire to provide future generations with a historical record of the outstanding student athletes and teams representing North Penn High School and its legacy schools (Hatfield High School, Lansdale High School, and North Wales High School). This history, which provides both a source of pride and a standard to emulate, dates back to 1887.

On October 8, 2005, the NPAAA hosted its Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony at North Penn High School. Fifty two athletes (spanning eight decades) and one team were inducted. The ceremony was attended by several hundred people and included the enthusiastic endorsement and participation of North Penn School District Officials. A program was provided that included the history of the schools, a history of the team inducted, and profiles of the inducted athletes. An announcement was made at this event about plans to establish a permanent Hall of Fame Wall in North Penn High School. This initiative was presented to North Penn High School Officials and was enthusiastically approved.

A fundraising campaign was initiated immediately following the Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Event and by Mid-August 2006, the NPAAA raised sufficient funding to proceed with the creation of the Hall of Fame Wall. A vendor was selected to provide the raised metal plaques that would be installed on the Wall of Fame in North Penn High School.

In addition, The North Penn Alumni Athletic Association, as part of its Sports Hall of Fame mission, gives Special Recognition to teams that did not achieve PIAA State Championship level, but won league a championship along with other NPHS league championship teams in any given year; or a team(s) that in the opinion of the NPAAA Board of Directors should be recognized for their unique contribution to North Penn High School sports history. Three special recognition plaques have been installed on the Wall of Honor.

On May 16, 2011, the NPAAA Board of Directors again approved the expansion of its current mission of providing scholarships to senior student athletes and the creation of the Sports Hall of Fame, to establishing a “Lifetime Achievement Hall of Fame” to be installed in North Penn High School. The NPAAA has now expanded its mission to honor all North Penn High School & Legacy School graduates who have made significant contributions to society in the Arts, Sciences, Law, Medical, Business, performing arts, and public service or education fields of endeavor.

This initiative was presented to, and approved by, the North Penn School District Superintendent and North Penn High School Principal. The NPAAA has been provided a wall at North Penn High School (separate from the Athletic Wall of Honor) to display inductee profile plaques. This year (2018) we are inducting our Eighth Lifetime Achievement award winner.

Since 2005 and including the Event on October 6, 2018 we have installed 172 plaques for the individual athletes, 38 team plaques, 8 Lifetime Achievement plaques, and special recognition plaques on the Halls of Fame Walls of Honor.

Juliana Schulte O'Reilly North Penn High School, 1982

In 1979, as a freshman, Juli led the North Penn Girls Swimming & Diving team to their First PIAA Girls Swimming & Diving Championship. Juli swam the leadoff leg of the State Championship 200 Medley Relay; anchored the 2nd place 400 Freestyle Relay and placed 3rd in the 100 Backstroke. She was an NISCA All-American 4 consecutive years (1979-1982) in the 100, 200, and 500 Freestyle, 100 Backstroke, 200 Medley Relay and 400 Freestyle Relay. Juli was 1st Team All State all four years that she swam for NPHS. She qualified for and swam in the 100, 200, 400 and 800 Freestyle at the US Olympic Trials, one of only 28 women to ever do so in the history of US Swimming, as well as the 100 Backstroke. She held the NPHS school records in the 100 and 200 Freestyles for over 30 years. She was Captain of the Girls Swimming & Diving Team in both her junior and senior years as well as Captain of the Girls Tennis Team her senior year. Upon graduation from NPHS, Juli attended the University of Virginia (UVA) on a swimming scholarship where she received her Bachelors of Arts in History in 1986. She was a five time NCAA All-American as well as All-Atlantic Coast Conference and an NCAA qualifier all four years. She captained the Women's Swimming & Diving Team in both her third and fourth year. During her college years, Juli was also an active volunteer with the NCAA's Big Brothers and Big Sisters program, President of the UVA History Honor Society, President of the Athletic Captain's Council, a resident of UVA's historic Lawn, and was inducted into the Omicron Delta Kappa leadership society.

Except for the occasional open water swim, Juli hung up her competition suit and goggles in 1986 to pursue her legal career. She graduated from George Washington University Law School in 1989, where she was an editor of the school's newspaper *The Advocate*, and became a partner in the Financial Services Practice of Venable LLP in Washington, DC in 1998. She continued her legal practice at Fannie Mae, leading its Regulatory and Legislative practice group as Vice President. In 2008, Juli joined the General Counsel's Office of American Express as its Vice President and Chief Bank Regulatory Counsel. Today, she serves as a Senior Vice President and Managing Counsel for Regulatory, Banking & Insurance and sits on the leadership teams of the company's General Counsel and its Chief Risk Officer.

During her nearly 30 years practicing law, Juli has been a Vice Chair of the American Bar Association's Banking Law Committee and Chair of numerous subcommittees. She was active in the Women's Bar Association of DC and its Foundation; serving as a board member and holding leadership positions on various committees as well as a founder of the Women in Housing & Finance Foundation. She is currently the Vice President of the Virginia Athletics Foundation, a non-profit that fully funds all athletic scholarships at UVA, as well as raises funds for athletic facilities and operations, and she previously served as a board member and Audit Committee Chair of the College Foundation at UVA. She served as a coach, manager and treasurer of her daughters' house and travel soccer teams.

Juli credits her deceased parents, John R. Schulte, a former leader of the Nor-Gwyn Pool Commission and champion swimmer, and Regina H. "Jeanne" O'Connor, a former NPHS employee and dedicated fitness buff, as well as her brothers and sisters, for her work ethic, integrity, commitment to community, and love of sports. She also credits Pat Henry, Rick Carroll, and the numerous coaches and assistant coaches at North Penn Aquatic Club, Nor-Gwyn Swim Team, Germantown Academy Aquatic Club and the University of Virginia for the incredible support and inspiration she received during her athletic career – all of which has served her well during her simultaneous parenting and legal careers. Juli also thanks all of the amazing teachers and administrators at each of the schools she attended during her 13 years in the North Penn School District for fostering her love of reading, ambition to solve problems and desire to be the best at whatever she set her mind to.

Juli counts among her greatest achievements a 26 year marriage to Brian T. O'Reilly and her two beautiful and talented daughters, Jacqueline, 23, a 2017 graduate of the UVA, and Meaghan 20, a third year at UVA.

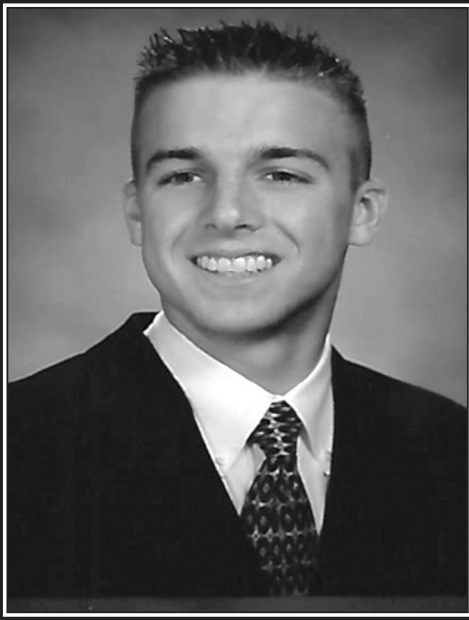
Brendan Fanslau is honored to be part of the 2018 class of inductees being elected into the North Penn Athletic Hall of Fame. During his time at North Penn, Brendan was fortunate to be teamed up with a talented group of swimmers, divers, water polo players and coaches. The Class of 2006 was part of 2 State Swimming Championships (2003 and 2004) as well as a Runner up State Championship (2005) and a third place finish (2006). During their reign, the teams overall record was 51-2, as well as winning the District One Championship Meet all four years. In addition to swimming, Brendan also participated on the water polo team where North Penn won the State Championship in 2004, as well as Runner up State Champions in 2002 and 2005. The overall record during those years was 95-13.

Brendan began his swimming career with the Towamencin Swim Team and soon transitioned into year round swimming with the North Penn Aquatic Club. In 2002, Brendan joined the North Penn High School Swimming and Water Polo teams. Little did anyone imagine the impact that Brendan would have on both programs. By the end of his career, Brendan was a 5 time NISCA All American Swimmer, 2006 State Champion in 100 Freestyle, 7 Time All State 1st Team Swimmer, 2006 District 1 Swimmer of the Meet, 6 Time District 1 Champion, NISCA All American Water Polo Player, 3 Time All State Water Polo Player, 2005 Mr. Water Polo (Best Water Polo player in the state) and a 7 season letter winner. Brendan also showed great leadership being named captain of both teams in his senior year.

Brendan played an integral role in the swim team's success by being a State qualifier his Sophomore, Junior and Senior years. During his sophomore year he was a key member of all three relays including a Silver in the 200 Medley Relay and a Bronze in both the 200 and 400 Freestyle Relays. He also placed 10th in the 100 Freestyle. These three relays and his points in the 100 Free were the foundation of the Team Title in 2004. During his junior year, he continued his success by taking 7th in the 200 Medley Relay, 4th in the 200 Free Relay and 5th in the 400 Free Relay. He also placed 9th in the 100 Freestyle. These three relays and his points from the 100 Free were also the foundation of the Runner Up Team Title in 2005. During his senior year, he won the state championship in the 100 Freestyle and his Bronze in the 200 Freestyle broke the team record. Once again he was a key member of the 200 Free Relay placing 9th and the 400 Free relay placing 4th. His extraordinary effort helped his team place 3rd at the 2006 State Championships.

After college, Jay immediately began his training/coaching career by starting "Jameson Basketball" in 2002. Jameson Basketball was an immediate hit with the local basketball community. He has trained many players who went on to play in college and developed special relationships with all of his players. He also trained NBA Lottery picks Gerald Henderson, JR. and Rondae Hollis-Jefferson.

As a student at North Penn High School, Josh spent just about every morning or afternoon either in the pool or on the baseball field. Athletics were a critical part of his high school career as he achieved 10 varsity letters and was named top athlete his junior and senior years.

In the pool, Josh was a member of the 2002 and 2003 swimming State Championship teams. He had his best year as senior when achieved 1st Team All-State honors in the 200 and 400 Freestyle Relays as the team that year finished runner-up at State Championships. I am honored to be a part of the 2018 class of inductees being elected into the North Penn Athletic Hall of Fame. My athletic career began at a very young age on a Little League Baseball Field in Hatfield. At one point in my athletic career, I was participating in five sports, Field Hockey, Basketball, Softball, Soccer, and Swimming. At North Penn High School, I earned 7 varsity letters, 2 Field Hockey (Co-Captain), 3 Basketball, and 2 Softball (Co-Captain).

Field Hockey 1988-1990 - In 1989 we placed 3rd in the league. My most memorable moment in Field Hockey was in 1990 against Council Rock, when we upset them 1-0. I scored off a broken corner midway through the second half to get the victory. I was awarded Most Valuable Player and First Team All-League that season. I played in the Philadelphia All-Star Field Hockey Classic to end my high school hockey career.

Basketball 1989-1991 - I earned my first varsity letter as a sophomore. As a junior, I was a part of the first NP Girls Basketball Team (1989/90) to make District Semifinals, first time to District Finals at Villanova (DuPont Pavilion) and most wins in a season. I was Second Team All-League and received Most Improved Player Award. In 1991 we ended the regular season undefeated with a 24-0 record. Never before has the North Penn Girls' Basketball team ended its regular season undefeated. We were Colonial Division Champs. Two years in a row (1990/1991), the Maidens were the District Class AAAA Second Place Team. For two consecutive years, we won the West Chester of Columbus Holiday Tournament. I was nominated for First Team SOL Basketball Tournament Unanimous Selection and Knights of Columbus Basketball Tournament MVP. The team averaged 76 points game and 2,200 total points over the season. I received the Senior Year Award at the end of the season.

Softball 1989-1991 - In 1990 the girls' softball team was Suburban One League Champs finishing the season with a 22-4 record. We were fortunate enough to advance to the District and State Tournament that season. I was second Team All-League. In 1991 we clinched the Suburban One title and placed second in the District One Tournament, ended the season with an impressive 22-5 record. Unfortunately, I suffered a knee

During her time at North Penn, Lindsay was part of a very talented group of players and coaches for both basketball and softball. Her teammates remember Lindsay for her tenacity and success on both the basketball court and the softball field.

At a young age, you could find Lindsay almost every day out in her driveway with her father Walt practicing her pitching. If she was not working on her change-up or drop curve, the next place you may find her was at the local elementary school's basketball court. She and her father would be out there for hours working on basketball drills over and over again, until the skill was mastered. Her talent was quickly noticed by both the North Penn High School's basketball and softball coaches. Shortly thereafter, she was requested to be a part of the Basketball and Softball team as a Freshman. Lindsay's exceptional athleticism had made her a key attribute to both teams.

Over the course of four years, Lindsay proved to be a key part of North Penn's Women's Basketball team's success. Lindsay earned the North Penn High School's MVP award in 2001, 2002, and 2003 years and was also a recipient of the 2003 NPHS First Team Basketball Award. Lindsay also had earned her name on the 1,000 point scorer banner, where she racked in 1015 career points. During her senior year, she earned 19 consecutive double doubles and placed in the top of the state's record holders for grabbing 34 rebounds in one game. Lindsay also received the honor of the First Team Suburban I All League Basketball Team in 2002 and 2003.

On the softball field, it was safe to say she excelled even more than she did on the basketball court. Throwing at a high speed on 63 mph, Lindsay was notorious for her drop curve pitch and had great knowledge of ball placement. Mickey Wetzel Kutzler is honored to be a part of the 2018 North Penn Hall of Fame Class. Mickey was a three-time varsity letter winner in girls' basketball and student class president in her junior and senior years. Mickey was dedicated to NPHS as a student athlete and leader. In 1991, she was awarded a congressional medal of merit, the Mildred Kratz Reichley Award for excellent school spirit, devotion, loyalty and scholastic achievement as a student athlete, and the NPHS outstanding senior for her dedication and commitment to the senior class at graduation.

Mickey was the MVP and Co-Captain in 1990 and 1991 of a special maidens' basketball team coached under Jim Crawford, Jr. Mickey led the maidens team that set new standards for NPHS girls' basketball with their intimidating defense and scoring power shared across many contributing seniors, finishing the regular 1991 league season with an undefeated record of 24-0 (27-2 overall). During the 1991 regular season, the team averaged an astounding 76 points per game and scored 2,200 total points over the season. They ended the season as Suburban One League (SOL) Basketball Champions and District One basketball runner ups.

Mickey finished her senior year with 981 career points over 3 varsity seasons, and was named to the 1990 and 1991 First Team SOL Basketball Unanimous Selection. In her senior season, she was named the Montgomeryville Spirit Co-Player of the Year and one of the super 10's, the Intelligencer All Area Basketball First Team and to the Philadelphia Inquirer All Southeastern PA girls basketball Second Team. Mickey earned a full scholarship to Temple University for basketball in 1991 where she was a four-year letter winner. After suffering a devastating knee injury at the start of her freshman season, she showed great resilience and grit and came back to compete for the Temple Lady Owls from 1991-1996, as a 5th year senior. She was named Co-captain of the Lady Owls in 1994, 1995, and 1996. In 1995, she was named to the Philadelphia Big Five Conference All-Academic Team, received the Temple Athletics Owl Club Outstanding Academic Achievement Award, and was a two-time recipient of the Henry R. Sklar Award for academic achievement, leadership and dedication to Temple Athletics.

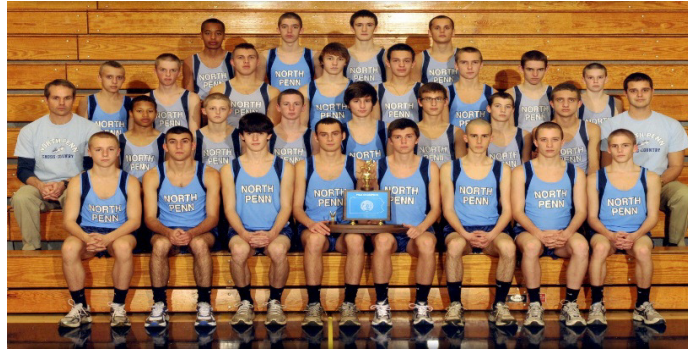

Inducted NPAAA Hall of Fame – 2018

2011 Cross Country Team PIAA State Champions
“No one expected North Penn to take the AAA State Title. But they did.
They practiced for it.” Cory Mull - PA Milesplit

After a third place finish at the District 1 Championships, the 2011 North Penn Boys Cross Country had an “uphill battle” in Hershey in trying to erase a 66 point gap to District 1 Champion West Chester Henderson and overcome a seventh place Milesplit ranking in the PIAA to achieve its third State Title in program history.

The journey toward a 2011 State Title began in 2010. The young Knights took second in the Suburban One Continental Conference Championships; however, they knew the importance of experiencing States in 2010 to set up competing at States in 2011. Taking a surprising second place in the 2010 District 1 Championships, the Knights qualified for States in 2010 and traveled to Hershey to gain the much needed experience needed to win in 2011.

The 2011 season had its share of ups and downs but the dual meet results were consistent with the posting of a perfect 10-0 record. Through the dual meet season, their two-part focus was clear: minimize the gap between their first and fifth runner and become very strong at running hills.

The lessons in “gap control” were highlighted in a league meet at Souderton where the team missed their predetermined one through five runner gap limit. Consequently, they had to run repeat 1,000 meter intervals on Souderton’s track after the race. This lesson in emphasizing running as ONE UNIT proved very valuable in achieving post-season goals.

The lessons in “climbing” came from the invitational schedule. Two of the three invitationals focused on very strong competition at very challenging courses. At Briarwood (Belmont Plateau), North Penn took third behind nationally-ranked and undefeated Cardinal O’Hara and Delaware State Champion Salesianum. Taking third in early September to these two very strong programs gave the Knights confidence that with six weeks of focused training left in the season, there was time to make up some ground.

Two weeks later, North Penn took second place to Salesianum at their invitational on the most challenging course of the regular season. Finishing behind Salesianum again was not a goal; however, the Knights had shown growth since Briarwood; reducing their point gap behind the Delaware State Champion from nine to just three points in only two weeks. The climbing growth was a result of hard weekends spent training at Militia Hill and Peace Valley Park. With the postseason two weeks away, the Knights continued to visit Militia and Peace Valley to prepare for the last hilly course of the season...HERSHEY!

The first step in the 2011 postseason was the Suburban One League Continental Conference Championships. Taking five of the top thirteen places, North Penn ran away with the thirty-eight-point victory. Jack Macauley, Dan Davis and Chris Trimble were all named First-Team All-League. Matt Molloy and Ryan Grace were named Second-Team All-League.

The second step in the postseason was the fastest race of the season in the District One Championship at Lehigh University. While Lehigh’s course didn’t provide an opportunity to showcase North Penn’s strength in climbing, it did give the Knights an opportunity to post the lowest one through five runner gap of the season . . . 43 seconds! This tight gap led to a third place finish out of fifty-five schools on a FLAT course. The question for the climbing Knights leading up to States . . .”If we were third on a flat course, what will we be on a hilly course?”

"We've done so many more hill workouts this year because we knew we would be at States," Junior Jack Macauley said. "Every Saturday morning, waking up at 6:30 to travel to Militia Hill or Peace Valley,

wherever we were going every Saturday morning when we didn't have a race. It was kind of grueling, but it paid off."

The trip to States in 2011 was different. North Penn was third place in District One and ranked seventh in the state. "No one paid attention to us," said Senior Dan Davis. Gap control and climbing was how North Penn prepared, and the results were going to be tied to that. "We knew we had to have our best race if we were going to get it," senior co-captain Chris Trimble added. "And we knew we could put together this race. We were ready for it; we trained for it. So we knew we would have a chance. To win the State Championships, North Penn was going to have to defeat undefeated and nationally ranked (#1 PA) Cardinal O'Hara.

Six weeks earlier at the Briarwood Invitational, O'Hara had defeated North Penn by 45 points. To give O'Hara their first loss of the season, North Penn was going to have to have their best meet climbing while also staying disciplined in their gap control.

Both teams got off to a great start! At the mile mark of this 5K (3.1 mile) race, Cardinal O'Hara took the team scoring lead with 95 points, with North Penn close behind with 98 points. The next 2.1 miles in Hershey featured several challenging hills that would ultimately determine the team champion. As they crossed the finish line, the results looked extremely close among several teams so no team was really talking about North Penn. After what felt like an eternity, the results were announced. For the first time since 1972, the PIAA AAA Boys Cross Country Team Championship was determined by a tiebreak! Both North Penn and Cardinal O'Hara scored 132 points. In cross country, a tiebreak is determined by the place of each team's sixth runner. North Penn's sixth runner finished twenty places ahead of Cardinal O'Hara's, giving North Penn their third state title in program history.

Junior Jack Macauley led the way in eleventh place, with Seniors Dan Davis and Chris Trimble close behind in eighteenth and twenty-first place, respectively. Sophomores Ryan Grace and Matt Molloy finished in 40th and 42nd. And rounding out the varsity team was Hunter Hill and Tyler Johnston in 65th and 117th. Climbing and gap control work paid off with the one through five runner gap for North Penn at 46 seconds to Cardinal O'Hara's 1:32.

The season of preparation paid off and the 2011 North Penn Boys Cross Country Team are State Champions! Congratulations to the entire team from both Coach Werner and Coach Hertz.

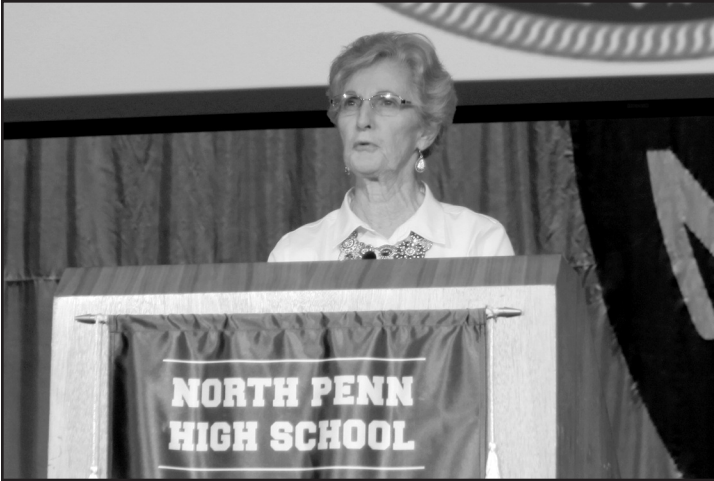

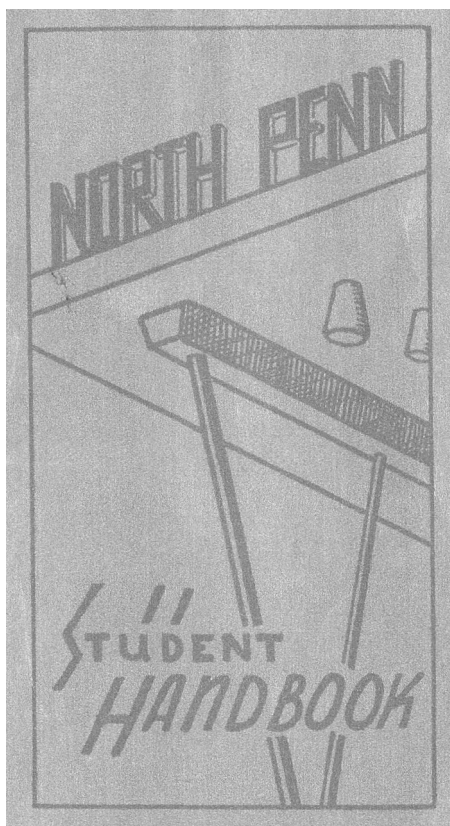

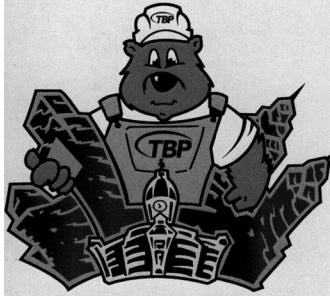
