Andy's sports career started when he was a shy, young boy in New Jersey playing little league baseball. After relocating to Pennsylvania as a fourth grader, Andy discovered sports as a positive way of interacting with others. Sports would continue to shape his life and the person he became. Andy found positive influences from coaches throughout his sports career and looked to them for guidance.

This scholarship was created by Andy's friends and family with the help of the NPAAA, to help keep his memory and dedication to sports alive, after losing his battle with pancreatic cancer on December 25, 2007. Andy understood the importance of a college education, and the struggle many families have with the growing cost of tuition. It was his dream to be able to reward the athletes of North Penn Athletics, by allowing them the opportunity to continue their athletic careers while receiving a college education.

In 2008, the North Penn Athletic Alumni Association presented 3 male athletes with the first scholarship in the name of Andy Kusma. The Andy Kusma Scholarship Fund has continued to grow since then, through in-kind donations and proceeds from the Andy Kusma Memorial Golf Tournament, now in its second year.

## **A History of the North Penn School System**

The roots of public education in the North Penn area predate the Civil War when simple one-room schoolhouses dotted the countryside. They offered schooling at the most basic level because all the primary grades were taught by a single teacher in that one-room environment. Students who wanted "higher" education had to travel to a town where advanced courses were available. As villages grew into larger boroughs in the 1880s, 12-year diploma programs were offered in these schools, and senior classes evolved – some with as few as a single student.

Lansdale School District was formed in 1871, a year before the community became an incorporated borough. In 1872, its first public school was built on East Main Street. The first graduating class in 1888 consisted of four students. The original school on Main Street was replaced by the larger Broad Street and Green Street schools in 1888 and 1899, respectively, but it was not until 1914 that the first Lansdale High School was built. An influx of new industries and affordable residential housing quickly pushed the high school building past capacity, and in 1930 the school board agreed to build a new high school on Penn Street, where there would be plenty of room for future expansion. Because of this foresight, the second

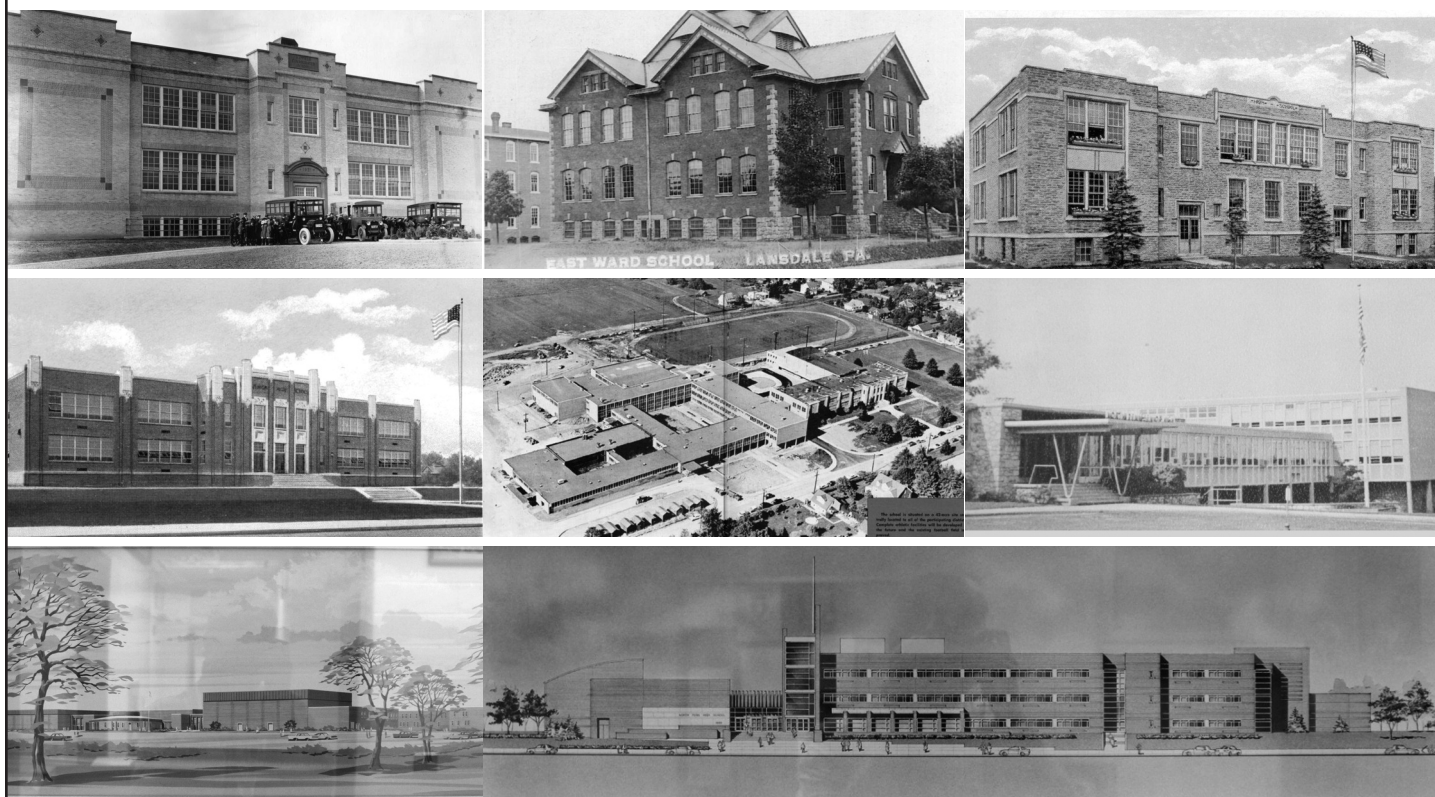


Lansdale High School stood the test of time much better than its predecessor. Over a period of 40 years, the campus grew to serve a total of seven towns and townships in the region. When regional consolidation took place in 1955, the Penn Street school underwent a massive expansion project that more than doubled the size of the original school. In June 1955, the final Lansdale High School diplomas were awarded, and three months later North Penn High School was born.

Like Lansdale, Hatfield's education system evolved from one-room schools into a larger school that began offering advanced grades during the 1890s. Hatfield Consolidated School District was formed in 1921 when residents of the borough and township agreed to erect a modern high school on the borough-township line in 1921. The new facility contained 19 rooms and was built on a 10 1/2-acre tract at Fairgrounds and Cowpath Roads. When the building opened in September 1922, it was the first six-year high school in this part of the state. A total of 492 students were brought together under the same roof, taught by a 15-member faculty. Hatfield High featured the largest auditorium and gymnasium between Philadelphia and the Lehigh Valley. Now the home of the Biblical Theological Seminary, Hatfield High School's last graduates received their diplomas in 1955. The high school closed its doors on June 10, 1955, and in September, 1955, Hatfield's underclassmen began attending the North Penn Joint High School in Lansdale.

Public education in North Wales also began with a one-room school located on Main Street that was built before the town was incorporated in 1869. The bustling young town soon outgrew its first schoolhouse and a new one was erected at Third and School Sts. By the 1890s that structure also proved inadequate and a three-story addition was built to house all 12 grades. North Wales held its first commencement in 1887 – with one student receiving a diploma. The School Street building was replaced in 1928 by what is now North Wales Elementary School on Summit Street. Like Lansdale and Hatfield, North Wales became a part of the North Penn Jointure in 1955, ending the era of independent school districts – and high schools – in each town.

To come full circle, the post-World War II construction boom impacted the once rural townships of Hatfield, Montgomery, Upper Gwynedd and Towamencin much like the rapid growth the borough experienced a half-century earlier. The venerable Lansdale/North Penn High School was no longer able to contain the influx of new students. In 1971 a new, massive high school campus was built in Towamencin, and Penn Street was converted into what is now Penndale Middle School.





## The History of the North Penn Alumni Athletic Association Two Hall of Fames

The NPAAA was founded in the year 2000 with a mission to uphold the standards and prestige of the North Penn High School athletic program and to encourage and promote higher education through scholarship awards to those student athletes who demonstrate courage and sacrifice during their athletic careers.

The NPAAA expanded its mission in 2004 when a decision was made by the Board of Directors to establish a sports Hall of Fame to recognize those alumni from North Penn High School and its legacy schools who best exemplified those high standards while participating in athletics in the high school.

After the NPAAA voted to initiate an athletic Hall of Fame, the Board of Directors proceeded with defining its vision. First, the NPAAA had to establish a qualification criteria and organizational guidelines to provide a systematic methodology for selecting inductees. Once that was established, the NPAAA created three committees: one to research, prioritize and select the inductees; a second to determine appropriate inductee awards and method of recognition; and a third to initiate a fundraising campaign to provide the monies necessary to support the NPAAA's dual mission of scholarship awards and athletic recognition.

The mission of the NPAAA is sustained by a desire to provide future generations with a historical record of the outstanding student athletes and teams representing North Penn High School and its legacy schools (Hatfield High School, Lansdale High School, and North Wales High School). This history, which provides both a source of pride and a standard to emulate, dates back to 1887.

On October 8, 2005, the NPAAA hosted its Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony at North Penn High School. Fifty two athletes (spanning eight decades) and one team were inducted. The ceremony was attended by several hundred people and included the enthusiastic endorsement and participation of North Penn School District Officials. A program was provided that included the history of the schools, a history of the team inducted, and profiles of the inducted athletes. An announcement was made at this event about plans to establish a permanent Hall of Fame Wall in North Penn High School. This initiative was presented to North Penn High School Officials and was enthusiastically approved.



A fundraising campaign was initiated immediately following the Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Event and by Mid-August 2006, the NPAAA raised sufficient funding to proceed with the creation of the Hall of Fame Wall. A vendor was selected to provide the raised metal plaques that would be installed on the Wall of Fame in North Penn High School.

In addition, The North Penn Alumni Athletic Association, as part of its Sports Hall of Fame mission, gives Special Recognition to teams that did not achieve PIAA State Championship level, but won league a championship along with other NPHS league championship teams in any given year; or a team(s) that in the opinion of the NPAAA Board of Directors should be recognized for their unique contribution to North Penn High School sports history. Three special recognition plaques have been installed on the Wall of Honor.

On May 16, 2011, the NPAAA Board of Directors again approved the expansion of its current mission of providing scholarships to senior student athletes and the creation of the Sports Hall of Fame, to establishing a “Lifetime Achievement Hall of Fame” to be installed in North Penn High School. The NPAAA has now expanded its mission to honor all North Penn High School & Legacy School graduates who have made significant contributions to society in the Arts, Sciences, Law, Medical, Business, performing arts, and public service or education fields of endeavor.

This initiative was presented to, and approved by, the North Penn School District Superintendent and North Penn High School Principal. The NPAAA has been provided a wall at North Penn High School (separate from the Athletic Wall of Honor) to display inductee profile plaques. This year (2019) we are inducting our Ninth Lifetime Achievement award winner.

Since 2005 and including the Event on October 12, 2019 we have installed 180 plaques for the individual athletes, 38 team plaques, 9 Lifetime Achievement plaques, and special recognition plaques on the Halls of Fame Walls of Honor.

Being the oldest of five children, competition has been a part of my DNA for as long as I can remember: whether it was to out run the others for the best seat in front of the television, being the first to yell 'shot-gun' to sit in the front seat of the car, the one-on-one basketball contests in the driveway, wiffle ballgames in the backyard or the constant jockeying of time for our parents' attention.

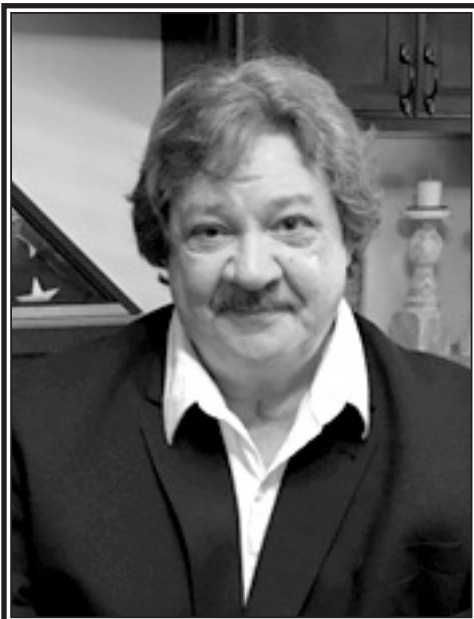
Competition played a part in shaping our identity, helping to develop who we were becoming as individuals.

Reminiscing about my involvement in sports, I had difficulty remembering things like goals scored, strike outs pitched or baskets made. My entire life had revolved around these many snapshots and events, yet I can only recall a precious few. What I do remember are the numerous conversations I had with my mom during the early 60s, questioning why I was not allowed to play Little League baseball. As I stood watching from outside of the baseball fence, I thought I was as good as, if not better, than some of the boys who were playing. When I asked my mother why I couldn't play, always in her most nurturing and sympathetic way, she could only say "because you are a girl", which I just didn't understand. At that point I didn't even bother asking about why I couldn't play Pee Wee football because I knew the answer was the same. Almost daily I would walk down to the basketball courts at York Avenue Elementary school, with the hope of somehow being asked to play in a game with the boys. Many days I just sat on my basketball, watching from the sidelines. Occasionally I would get into a game and did everything I could to prove that I could hold my own. Suddenly things began to change. Bud Cliver and Don Gibson, along with several other parents, started the North Penn Girls Softball League. I was a member of the very first group of girls to begin playing in the league. I thought who needs Little League.

We had our own uniforms and playing fields, and even better, we always got a hot dog and soda after the game, even if we didn't win! That led to me playing ASA travel softball for the next 20 years. Around the same time the softball league began, St. Stanislaus, where I went to elementary school, started a CYO girls' basketball program. I was a little confused as to why our uniform was a dress, actually a tunic, but at that point, it didn't matter because I was on a team playing basketball. During the summer, my parents insisted we take swimming lessons. Every morning I rode my bike to the 4th Street pool for a lesson and one morning Mr. Cash, the lifeguard who taught the lessons, said to me, "you should try out for the swim team". The next thing I knew, I was a member of the swim team. Without really knowing it at the time, each of these competitive opportunities helped lay the groundwork for what was to come in my life.

I want to take this opportunity to thank Tom Strickland and the Board of Directors, several of whom I know personally from the “olden days”. When I first talked to Tom, he explained to me the reasoning behind the establishment of the HOF. In 2005, 2006, and 2007 Sports Illustrated distinguished North Penn as having the best athletic program in Pennsylvania, noting that the school has "won 45 state championships over the last 10 years" He told me that up until then, there really was no history regarding recognition of all the athletes and teams that have helped North Penn to such elite status in the state and consequently, in the nation.

I started my athletic career on the hallowed fields of Hatfield Little League which is important to me because baseball was king for young kids growing up in the 60’s. At that age my father, Jack, and uncle, Norm Vincent, (my LL coach) were instrumental in teaching me the value of playing hard but with good sportsmanship.

I attended Pennfield Junior High where I started playing football, basketball and continued in baseball. I was cut from the basketball team in seventh grade. I had to find something to do and so I joined the wrestling team which worked out decidedly better. Thanks to wrestling coach Wayne Brunt and the basketball coach who cut me, John Bishop, whom I always liked simply because he is a good guy.

On to North Penn; the despised players from Pennbrook (hey it worked both ways) and the Pennfield players are now in the same locker rooms. Believe me; it didn’t take long for enemies to become hard and fast friends. Many of whom I am still in regular contact with to this day.

And it’s not just the athletes that deserve recognition. It is the student body, teachers, parents, and the entire community. They supported us no matter what the standings were; truly remarkable.

At the University of Delaware I was elected, unanimously, by my team mates, as offensive captain of my freshman team. We were told by none other than legendary coach, Tubby Raymond, that we were the best recruiting class ever at UD which is somewhat ironic Coach Raymond was as revered in the state as Delaware as Jopa was in Pennsylvania. We beat Penn State in a freshman game that year. But that’s a story for another time.

William “Bill” Coddington is honored to be a part of the 2019 class of inductees being selected for the North Penn Athletic Hall of Fame. Bill was a three-year starter for the Knights in football and a member of the “Wilde Bunch” 1983 Bux-Mont champions; a three-year letter winner for Coach Joe Heyer’s basketball team, and a sprinter for Coach Richard Swanker’s 1983 Bux-Mont Champion Track and Field team.

Bill enjoyed playing multiple sports throughout high school. As a sophomore in football he started as a wingback where he could serve as a runner, receiver and blocker. He also saw duty as a kick returner and defensive back that year. As a junior, North Penn won the championship over Mike Pettine’s dominant C.B. West Buck. Bill served as a tailback, fullback, outside linebacker and kick returner. That championship season is one of his fondest memories of high school athletics. During his senior year Bill served solely as a fullback and lead blocker for Scott Novak, and a linebacker on defense. He was selected as the only fullback on the All-Bux Mont team – 2nd team, and honorable mention All-District One, despite missing several games with a knee injury. Bill attended the College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, Massachusetts on a football scholarship. He went on to letter as a fullback and kick returner.

Even while playing football at Holy Cross, he was often chastised by the football coaching staff for being found playing countless hours of pick-up basketball which was his other love. He had the privilege of playing three years at North Penn for coaches, Joe Heyer and Nelson “Toby” Watton. Bill was a two-year starter and three-time letter winner who played guard and forward. He scored 900 points in the pre-three-point era. He was selected 2nd Team All-Bux Mont, All-Philadelphia Suburban Honorable Mention and the MVP as a senior. His greatest memory was a District One playoff victory over a heavily favored Lower Merion his junior year.

Bill was a sprinter for Coach Richard Swanker’s outstanding Track and Field team during his sophomore year. They won the 1983 Bux Mont Title, and Bill was a member of the 1st team all Bux Mont 4 x 100 relay team along with juniors, Kenny Durham and Derrick Luby, and senior Joe Sabio.

Along with specific recognition in various sports, Bill also received the Outstanding Athlete award and the Genuardi’s Most Athletic award at North Penn after his sophomore and senior year.

He graduated in 1990 with a BS in Secondary Education – English. Bill coached football at North Penn High School for two years (1990 and 1991) before moving onto coach at Souderton Area High School, where he was a teacher. Brian’s love of the sport of swimming began in the North Penn Community Aquatics learn-to-swim program (established by fellow NPAAA Hall of Fame member, Mr. Rick Carroll) and continues to this day on the deck of the Rick Carroll Natatorium.

At North Penn High School, Brian swam competitively from 1985-1989 for Mr. Carroll and NPAAA Hall of Fame coach, Bill Berardelli. He was a district qualifier and in his senior year, he was elected captain and received the Most Improved Swimmer over A Career Award.

During the summer of 1989, NPAAA Hall of Fame member, Selma Robinson, asked him to be an assistant coach for her at Manufacturers Golf and Country Club. It was here that his coaching career began. Each summer, he would come from Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP) and coach at “Mannies” honing his coaching skills all the while making swimming fun for the team.

After graduating with a degree in Environmental Science from IUP, he headed back home to Lansdale to start a position at Colorcon. But in 1995, when offered the assistant coach position of the Boys Swimming and Diving team at his alma mater, he could not pass up the opportunity. From 1995-2000, Brian coached under NPAAA Hall of Fame member, Bill Bartle. During their tenure, the Knights won four straight PIAA State Championships from 1997-2000. When Bill Bartle retired in May of 2000, Brian was named the head coach for the Boys & Girls Water Polo teams and the Boys Swimming and Diving team. Matt Finacchio is honored to be a 2019 inductee into the North Penn Athletic Hall of Fame. Matt was a four time varsity letter winner and captained the wrestling team during his junior and senior seasons. During Matt's time at North Penn he was fortunate to wrestle with an elite group of athletes and was a member of the 1987 State Championship Team.

Matt is the fourth of five children and grew up watching his oldest sibling, Tom, play football and baseball. At one of Tom's football games a coach from the North Penn Squires suggested that Matt and his brother Dan try wrestling, and so, at the age of five, Matt began wrestling for the North Penn Squires. He absolutely loved it. Matt did not attend the North Penn School district until ninth grade and did not have the benefit of wrestling for a middle school program. Starting in sixth grade, Matt began wrestling for Warrington's travel wrestling program, where coach Mokrynychuk introduced Matt to riding legs. Thanks to Coach Mokrynychuk and Coach Taylor at Rider University, Matt later became nationally recognized for his ability to ride legs. Matt was ranked eighth in the Country by USA Wrestling magazine and under Matt's picture the magazine referred to him as "the master of devastating leg rides."

When Matt entered high school he had big shoes to fill. His brother Dan (NPAAA Hall of Fame member & State Champion) was already a two year varsity letter winner and State place winner. Matt had the luxury of wrestling with Dan and competing in one of the best wrestling rooms in the State. This great sibling rivalry and competition in the wrestling room pushed Matt on a daily basis. As a freshman, Matt Qualified for States by winning the sectional, district and regional tournaments. Matt went 2-2 at states in a year when every win was critical because North Penn tied North Allegheny for the State Championship. Through Matt's four year career he went on to win three Sectional titles, four District titles, four Regional titles (at the time Matt was only the second wrestler in regional history to win 4 titles), and placed fourth at States. Matt ended his North Penn career with a record of 137-11 and only one career dual meet loss, resulting in a 92.5% winning percentage.

After High School, Matt went on to wrestle for three years at Rider University and two years at George Mason University. Matt was ranked in the country's top 12 for all four years of his college eligibility. At the Division I level Matt went on to be a two time ECC finalist, CAA Champion, Virginia Intercollegiate State Champion and All-American.

In her senior year, Amber led all of District 1 and suburban Philadelphia in scoring. She was selected to the First Team for the Intelligencer, Times Herald, and Philadelphia Inquirer-North all area teams. She played in a Pennsylvania All Star game following her senior year.

Amber spent the summer before her senior year playing on five basketball teams: her Fencor AAU team (with which she reached the AAU national playoffs in Dallas one year) and four different teams in four different summer leagues. On many occasions she played multiple games at different sites on the same day. She was the only returning starter her senior year at NPHS and one of only three returning letter winners. Amber led the team in points, assists, steals, and was two shy of the rebounding lead. She scored in double figures in every game. Her final two high school games were a 37 point performance in an upset win against the 9th ranked team in the district and 27 points, including 17 consecutive for her team, in a playoff game. Academically, Amber was on the honor roll or distinguished honor roll every marking period.

In addition to her passion for basketball, Amber also excelled as an equestrian and had her own horse, Doc. Riding and basketball competed for her time, but both were done at the highest level. The Philadelphia Inquirer ran a story on Amber's Delaware Valley College choice as "choosing hooves over hoops".

At Del Val Amber was a four year letter winner at guard and played on teams that earned three consecutive MAC Freedom Conference playoff berths. She played on an ECAC championship team which is also the winningest team in Del Val history. Another of her teams went to the MAC championship game for the only time in school history and also qualified for the ECAC tournament.

Amber was known for her court awareness, relentless desire to attack the basket as evidenced by her career ranking in free throws, and her speed. She usually matched up defensively against the opponent's best guard.

When Amber graduated, she ranked 4th on the career list with 1409 points, 3rd in assists, 1st in free

For me, sports and activities were the “other half” of education. Reflecting back on our own lives, the lessons that we have all learned from our own participation goes far beyond the game itself. In fact, it helped shape who we are, the friends we chose, the decisions to go to college, and for me, it led to a career path; giving me an opportunity to give back and reteach all the life lessons that I learned at such a fragile time in my life. It taught me about work ethic, dedication and what it meant to set a goal and achieve it together as a member of a team. It helped me excel academically and held me accountable in the classroom. Participation in sports is like a leadership laboratory, where we learned about failure, how to overcome adversity and how to rise above it.

Sports have taught me persistence, patience, self-control and helped me develop self-esteem and self-confidence. I’ve learned what it takes to be a real competitor and not just someone who wants to win. 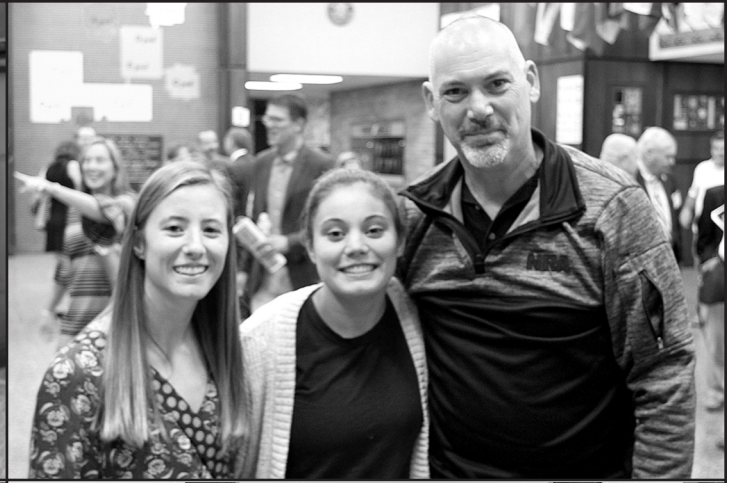

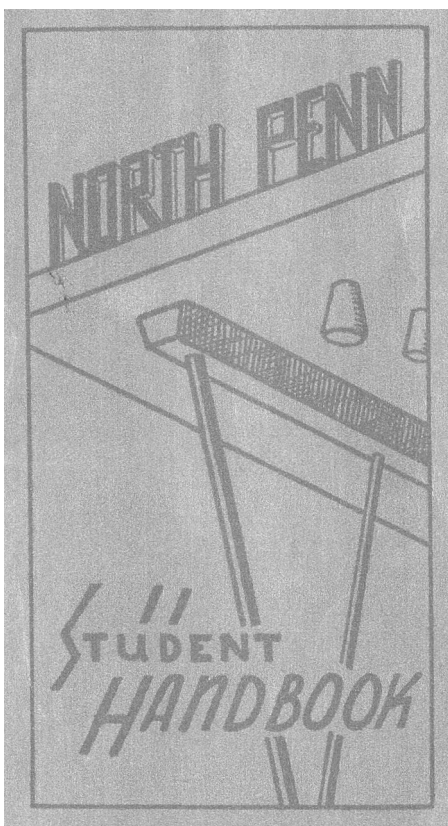

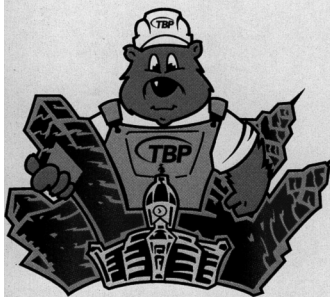
