A new and separate "Lifetime Achievement Hall of Fame Wall of Honor" was established and installed. This year we are honoring our 13th Lifetime Achievement Inductee.

In 2015, The North Penn Alumni Athletic Association, as part of its Sports Hall of Fame mission, now gives Special Recognition to individuals who did not meet the NPAAA Hall of Fame qualification criteria, but who have demonstrated remarkable athletic accomplishments and, in the opinion of the NPAAA Board of Directors, should be recognized for their unique contribution to North Penn High School sports history.

Dear North Penn Community,



Andy's sports career started when he was a shy, young boy in New Jersey playing little league baseball. After relocating to Pennsylvania as a fourth grader, Andy discovered sports as a positive way of interacting with others. Sports would continue to shape his life and the person he became. Andy found positive influences from coaches throughout his sports career and looked to them for guidance.

This scholarship was created by Andy's friends and family with the help of the NPAAA, to help keep his memory and dedication to sports alive, after losing his battle with pancreatic cancer on December 25, 2007. Andy understood the importance of a college education, and the struggle many families have with the growing cost of tuition. It was his dream to be able to reward the athletes of North Penn Athletics, by allowing them the opportunity to continue their athletic careers while receiving a college education.

In 2008, the North Penn Athletic Alumni Association presented 3 male athletes with the first scholarship in the name of Andy Kusma. The Andy Kusma Scholarship Fund has continued to grow since then, through in-kind donations and proceeds from the Andy Kusma Memorial Golf Tournament, now in its second year. A History of the North Penn School System

The roots of public education in the North Penn area predate the Civil War when simple one-room schoolhouses dotted the countryside. They offered schooling at the most basic level because all the primary grades were taught by a single teacher in that one-room environment. Students who wanted "higher" education had to travel to a town where advanced courses were available. As villages grew into larger boroughs in



the 1880s, 12-year diploma programs were offered in these schools, and senior classes evolved – some with as few as a single student.

Lansdale School District was formed in 1871, a year before the community became an incorporated borough. In 1872, its first public school was built on East Main Street. The first graduating class in 1888 consisted of four students. The original school on Main Street was replaced by the larger Broad Street and Green Street schools in 1888 and 1899, respectively, but it was not until 1914 that the first Lansdale High School was built. An influx of new industries and affordable residential housing quickly pushed the high school building past capacity, and in 1930 the school board agreed to build a new high school on Penn Street, where there would be plenty of room for future expansion. Because of this foresight, the second Lansdale High School stood the test of time much better than its predecessor. Over a period of 40 years, the campus grew to serve a total of seven towns and townships in the region. When regional consolidation took place in 1955, the Penn Street school underwent a massive expansion project that more than doubled the size of the original school. In June 1955, the final Lansdale High School diplomas were awarded, and three months later North Penn High School was born.

Like Lansdale, Hatfield's education system evolved from one-room schools into a larger school that began offering advanced grades during the 1890s. Hatfield Consolidated School District was formed in 1921 when residents of the borough and township agreed to erect a modern high school on the borough and township line in 1921. The new facility contained 19 rooms and was built on a 10 1/2-acre tract at Fairgrounds and Cowpath Roads. When the building opened in September 1922, it was the first six-year high school in this part of the state. A total of 492 students were brought together under the same roof, taught by a 15-member faculty. Hatfield High featured the largest auditorium and gymnasium between Philadelphia and the Lehigh Valley. Now the home of the Biblical Theological Seminary, Hatfield High School's last graduates received their diplomas in 1955. The high school closed its doors on June 10, 1955, and in September, 1955, Hatfield's underclassmen began attending the North Penn Joint High School in Lansdale.

Public education in North Wales also began with a one-room school located on Main Street that was built before the town was incorporated in 1869. The bustling young town soon outgrew its first schoolhouse and a new one was erected at Third and School Sts. By the 1890s that structure also proved inadequate and a three-story addition was built to house all 12 grades. North Wales held its first commencement in 1887 – with one student receiving a diploma. The School Street building was replaced in 1928 by what is now North Wales Elementary School on Summit Street. Like Lansdale and Hatfield, North Wales became a part of the North Penn Jointure in 1955, ending the era of independent school districts – and high schools – in each town.

To come full circle, the post-World War II construction boom impacted the once rural townships of Hatfield, Montgomery, Upper Gwynedd and Towamencin much like the rapid growth the borough experienced a half-century earlier. The venerable Lansdale/North Penn High School was no longer able to contain the influx of new students. In 1971 a new, massive high school campus was built in Towamencin, and Penn Street was converted into what is now Penndale Middle School.

The History of the North Penn Alumni Athletic Association Two Hall of Fames

The NPAAA was founded in the year 2000 with a mission to uphold the standards and prestige of the North Penn High School athletic program and to encourage and promote higher



education through scholarship awards to those student athletes who demonstrate courage and sacrifice during their athletic careers.

The NPAAA expanded its mission in 2004 when a decision was made by the Board of Directors to establish a sports Hall of Fame to recognize those alumni from North Penn High School and its legacy schools who best exemplified those high standards while participating in athletics in the high school.

After the NPAAA voted to initiate an athletic Hall of Fame, the Board of Directors proceeded with defining its vision. First, the NPAAA had to establish a qualification criteria and organizational guidelines to provide a systematic methodology for selecting inductees. Once that was established, the NPAAA created three committees: one to research, prioritize and select the inductees; a second to determine appropriate inductee awards and method of recognition; and a third to initiate a fundraising campaign to provide the monies necessary to support the NPAAA's dual mission of scholarship awards and athletic recognition.

The mission of the NPAAA is sustained by a desire to provide future generations with a historical record of the outstanding student athletes and teams representing North Penn High School and its legacy schools (Hatfield High School, Lansdale High School, and North Wales High School). This history, which provides both a source of pride and a standard to emulate, dates back to 1887.

On October 8, 2005, the NPAAA hosted its Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony at North Penn High School. Fifty two athletes (spanning eight decades) and one team were inducted. The ceremony was attended by several hundred people and included the enthusiastic endorsement and participation of North Penn School District Officials. A program was provided that included the history of the schools, a history of the team inducted, and profiles of the inducted athletes. An announcement was made at this event about plans to establish a permanent Hall of Fame Wall in North Penn High School. This initiative was presented to North Penn High School Officials and was enthusiastically approved.

A fundraising campaign was initiated immediately following the Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Event and by Mid-August 2006, the NPAAA raised sufficient funding to proceed with the creation of the Hall of Fame Wall. A vendor was selected to provide the raised metal plaques that would be installed on the Wall of Fame in North Penn High School.

In addition, The North Penn Alumni Athletic Association, as part of its Sports Hall of Fame mission, gives Special Recognition to teams that did not achieve PIAA State Championship level, but won league a championship along with other NPHS league championship teams in any given year; or a team(s) that in the opinion of the NPAAA Board of Directors should be recognized for their unique contribution to North Penn High School sports history. Three special recognition plaques have been installed on the Wall of Honor.

On May 16, 2011, the NPAAA Board of Directors again approved the expansion of its current mission of providing scholarships to senior student athletes and the creation of the Sports Hall of Fame, to establishing a "Lifetime Achievement Hall of Fame" to be installed in North Penn High School. The NPAAA has now expanded its mission to honor all North Penn High School & Legacy School graduates who have made significant contributions to society in the Arts, Sciences, Law, Medical, Business, performing arts, and public service or education fields of endeavor.

This initiative was presented to, and approved by, the North Penn School District Superintendent and North Penn High School Principal. The NPAAA has been provided a wall at North Penn High School (separate from the Athletic Wall of Honor) to display inductee profile plaques. This year (2024) we are inducting our Twelfth Lifetime Achievement award winner. Since 2005, we have installed 197 plaques for individual athletes, 47 team plaques, 12 Lifetime Achievement plaques, and additional special recognition plaques on the Halls of Fame Walls of Honor.

Paul Delp graduated from North Penn High School in 1961. He was persuaded by friends and family to apply and was accepted by Penn State in the Business School. Paul graduated in 1965 with a BS degree in Business Logistics, now known as Supply Chain. After graduation, he enlisted in the Air Force and became a Loadmaster on C-130 cargo airplanes, spending most of his last two years in the service assigned to an Aerial Port Squadron in Okinawa, Japan. Much of this assignment consisted of making monthly trips to South Vietnam for two-week assignments that included resupply airdrops and remote landings at airbases and locations throughout the country. One year into his four-year enlistment, Paul and Lynne married at Langley Air Force Base in Virginia. Lynne then accompanied Paul to Okinawa, and their son Josh was born at an Army Hospital in 1969. Paul also became an Instructor Loadmaster during his service and quickly reached the rank of Staff Sergeant. Paul was honorably discharged in the spring of 1970. Kate (Strong) Deluise, and Shannon Strong are honored to accept the induction into the North Penn Alumni Athletic Association Hall of Fame on behalf of our sister, Jennifer Strong.

Jennifer was a soccer standout in both scholastic and club settings. In 1989, during Jennifer's sophomore year of high school, she became the first and only female to play on the North Penn High School Men's Varsity Soccer Team. The following year North Penn started their first Women's Soccer Program. During this inaugural season, her junior year, Jennifer earned the very first MVP award for the women's soccer team. The following year as a senior, Jennifer led the team to a Suburban One League Championship while again earning the team's MVP.

While attending high school and playing for North Penn, Jennifer was also playing soccer on multiple club and select teams. Jennifer's club team, Buckingham, was the Eastern Pennsylvania Youth Soccer Association State Championship for three years in a row. During this she was selected to and played with the following Olympic Development Program Teams: Eastern Pennsylvania Youth Soccer Association U-16 through U-19 soccer teams, Region 1 U-16 through U-19 teams and the National U-17 and U19 teams.

In addition to excelling in soccer, Jennifer was also a three-time varsity letter winner in Women's Basketball. As the starting point guard, Jennifer orchestrated three dominant years of women's basketball at North Penn. During those three years, the team won three Suburban One League Championships and earned second in Districts in 1990. And, in 1991, Jennifer was awarded the co-senior award.

After graduating from North Penn, Jennifer earned a full scholarship to play women's soccer at the University of Connecticut, which at the time was ranked No. 2 in NCAA Division One. In 1991, after playing her first season at UConn, Jennifer was selected to the Soccer America All-Freshman Team and was an Academic All American. In 1992, she was included in the NSCAA/Adidas All-Northeast Region and NEWISA All-New England selections. And, while playing for the United States Women's National Soccer Team in 1992, Jennifer assisted a goal against Denmark.

In 1993, Jennifer transferred to Barry University and continued her soccer career. In 1993, Barry University won the NCAA Division II Championship and Jennifer was named to the NCAA All-Tournament Women's Soccer Team, while also earning NSCAA All-Region Team honors. After a hiatus in 1994, Jennifer returned to play for Barry University in 1995 and took the team to the NCAA finals again that season, finishing second. Jennifer was named to the NCAA All-American Women's Soccer team and received NSCAA All-Region Team honors. In 1996, Jennifer was selected as a CoSIDA Academic All-American and All-District player while also invited to play in the "1996 Umbro Select All Star Game."

In 1996, Jennifer graduated from Barry University with Magna Cum Laude, earning a B.S. in Biology and was later inducted into Barry University's Student/Athlete Hall of Fame. She went on to attend medical school at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine on a full Army Scholarship. While earning her D.O., Jennifer took up mountain biking and triathlons and was invited to compete in the X Games for off track triathlon. She was unable to compete, however, due to medical school obligations. Jennifer also started playing rugby while in med school with PCOM's women's team. Soon she was invited to play for the city of Philadelphia. While playing for the Philadelphia team, scouts invited her to play with the National Women's Rugby Team, the Eagles. She declined the invitation to focus on medical school and her career.

After receiving her D.O. from PCOM in 2001, Jennifer served in the United States Army for five years while completing her residency and specializing in obstetrics and gynecology. While she was stationed in Oahu, she played soccer recreationally for one year and then hung up her boots to focus on her career as an obstetrician/gynecologist.

Jennifer completed her military service as a Major, earning an award for saving the lives of her patient and newborn. She then moved to Grand Junction, Colorado to start her OB/BYU practice and to enjoy mountain biking and snowboarding in the Rocky Mountains. For five years, she provided care for countless women through their pregnancies and childbirth.

On March 27, 2011, Jennifer sadly died at the age of 37.

Jennifer was a stalwart defender in soccer, an artist on the basketball court, a fearless biker, tenacious rugby player, and a graceful snowboarder. She was fiercely competitive, coordinated and agile, and a tactical genius. She had the perfect combination of traits that made her one of the most exceptional athletes to ever play a sport at North Penn High School.

I am honored to be among the athletes to be inducted into the North Penn Alumni Athletic Association Hall of Fame. It is thrilling to see so many athletes from the great class of 1991 inducted today, as well as in previous years.

I would not be receiving this recognition without the support of my greatest coaches and fans—my parents Rocci and Cheryl Pignoli. They co-coached my sister Tina and I in our very first season of tee ball. My Mom and Grandmother (Mom-Mom) traveled thousands of miles to see almost every game I played from youth sports throughout my collegiate career. In my junior year of high school my father converted a warehouse into an indoor softball facility with a batting cage and fielding area. As I progressed through high school my father developed a parallel passion for softball and rose to be a high school and later Division I college coach, as I ascended to play those levels as well. Coach Rocci was the assistant coach under Joan Moser here at North Penn for my Junior and Senior years, when our softball team finished second and first in the PIAA District State Championships.

As a three-sport athlete, I was fortunate to have had exceptional coaches and teammates to teach me so many valuable lessons and help mold me into a scholar-athlete and the human being I am today. Here at North Penn, Joan Moser, a legend herself, has influenced me and countless other young women, more than I imagine she would ever take credit for. As a coach, she was calm, composed, demanding, and commanded the utmost respect from her players. She could scold you with the subtle raise of her eyebrow or worse yet, a notation on her infamous notecard. Coach Moser also was generous in her ability to shower her players with praise with her distinctive smile. Sure, we wanted to win, but more than that, we could not disappoint her. She prepared us mentally and physically, providing a consistent atmosphere where we trusted each other and her every coaching move. We were drilled in the fundamentals and knowledge of the game and prepared for every possible situation. We worked hard, played hard, and reaped the rewards.

My best friends in high school were also my teammates. We enjoyed ourselves, laughed together, and we held one another accountable. We could poke fun at our own mistakes and celebrate each other's triumphs. What I would give to be back on the diamond one more time with Trish Thomas, Cheryl Milligan, Heather Gazan, Lori Flyzik and of course our incredibly talented pitcher, Carla Hensler.

Everything I learned at North Penn equipped me for my collegiate career. At Princeton I had the great fortune of working with phenomenal coaches—particularly Cindy Cohen, who established a dynasty on the 1895 field and brought her scholarship-less teams into the national spotlight to compete with the top 8 teams across the country in the 1995 and 1996 Women's College World Series. Coach Cohen had passion, commitment, and the ceaseless energy it takes to build a program like she did. She was as demanding of her players as she was of herself. My college teammates are some of the most impressive people I've ever known. They raised the bar in every way in terms of preparation, work ethic, the mental game, skill, grit, and the sacrifices you make to succeed as a team.

After graduating from college, I worked in a non-profit organization run by the former Commissioner of Education for the state of New Jersey. I then began my public teaching career which I am currently in my 30th year of teaching History, Psychology, and Philosophy in public high schools in New Jersey and Colorado. I co-created a Humanities program that continues to this day. For this unique curriculum, I was recognized in 2005 as the New Jersey Council for the Humanities Teacher of the Year. Like so many of my teammates from high school I went on to coach, inspired of course by my dad, but also by the many formative coaches I was so lucky to have. I coached high school softball for 17 seasons and was named the Union County Softball Coach of the Year in 2004 after coaching our team to its first ever North II Group IV State Sectional Championship. I coached until I gave birth to my oldest son, Langston. A year and a half later, my son Miles was born. The greatest challenge and accomplishment of my life has been, and continues to be, raising these beautiful young boys into great young men. I am their greatest fan as they are mine and I am so excited to continue guiding them into their unwritten futures where they can realize their greatest dreams.

Pride and tradition are two core values which encapsulate athletics at North Penn High School and at Princeton University. I feel tremendous gratitude for benefiting from and contributing to the legacy at both institutions.


Stephanie Knauer is honored to be inducted into the North Penn Alumni Athletic Association Hall of Fame.


