

Andy Kusma Memorial Award

Andy's sports career started when he was a shy, young boy in New Jersey playing little league baseball. After relocating to Pennsylvania as a fourth grader, Andy discovered sports as a positive way of interacting with others. Sports would continue to shape his life and the person he became. Andy found positive influences from coaches throughout his sports career and looked to them for guidance.

This scholarship was created by Andy's friends and family with the help of the NPAAA, to help keep his memory and dedication to sports alive, after losing his battle with pancreatic cancer on December 25, 2007. Andy understood the importance of a college education, and the struggle many families have with the growing cost of tuition. It was his dream to be able to reward the athletes of North Penn Athletics, by allowing them the opportunity to continue their athletic careers while receiving a college education.

In 2008, the North Penn Athletic Alumni Association presented 3 male athletes with the first scholarship in the name of Andy Kusma. The Andy Kusma Scholarship Fund has continued to grow since then, through in-kind donations and proceeds from the Andy Kusma Memorial Golf Tournament, now in its second year.

A History of the North Penn School System


The roots of public education in the North Penn area predate the Civil War when simple one-room schoolhouses dotted the countryside. They offered schooling at the most basic level because all the primary grades were taught by a single teacher in that one-room environment. Students who wanted "higher" education had to travel to a town where advanced courses were available. As villages grew into larger boroughs in the 1880s, 12-year diploma programs were offered in these schools, and senior classes evolved – some with as few as a single student.

Lansdale School District was formed in 1871, a year before the community became an incorporated borough. In 1872, its first public school was built on East Main Street. The first graduating class in 1888 consisted of four students. The original school on Main Street was replaced by the larger Broad Street and Green Street schools in 1888 and 1899, respectively, but it was not until 1914 that the first Lansdale High School was built. An influx of new industries and affordable residential housing quickly pushed the high school building past capacity, and in 1930 the school board agreed to build a new high school on Penn Street, where there would be plenty of room for future expansion. Because of this foresight, the second Lansdale High School stood the test of time much better than its predecessor. Over a period of 40 years, the campus grew to serve a total of seven towns and townships in the region. When regional consolidation took place in 1955, the Penn Street school underwent a massive expansion project that more than doubled the size of the original school. In June 1955, the final Lansdale High School diplomas were awarded, and three months later North Penn High School was born.

Like Lansdale, Hatfield's education system evolved from one-room schools into a larger school that began offering advanced grades during the 1890s. Hatfield Consolidated School District was formed in 1921 when residents of the borough and township agreed to erect a modern high school on the boroughtownship line in 1921. The new facility contained 19 rooms and was built on a 10 1/2-acre tract at Fairgrounds and Cowpath Roads. When the building opened in September 1922, it was the first six-year high school in this part of the state. A total of 492 students were brought together under the same roof, taught by a 15-member faculty. Hatfield High featured the largest auditorium and gymnasium between Philadelphia and the Lehigh Valley. Now the home of the Biblical Theological Seminary, Hatfield High School's last graduates received their diplomas in 1955. The high school closed its doors on June 10, 1955, and in September, 1955, Hatfield's underclassmen began attending the North Penn Joint High School in Lansdale.

Public education in North Wales also began with a one-room school located on Main Street that was built before the town was incorporated in 1869. The bustling young town soon outgrew its first schoolhouse and a new one was erected at Third and School Sts. By the 1890s that structure also proved inadequate and a three-story addition was built to house all 12 grades. North Wales held its first commencement in 1887 – with one student receiving a diploma. The School Street building was replaced in 1928 by what is now North Wales Elementary School on Summit Street. Like Lansdale and Hatfield, North Wales became a part of the North Penn Jointure in 1955, ending the era of independent school districts – and high schools – in each town.

To come full circle, the post-World War II construction boom impacted the once rural townships of Hatfield, Montgomery, Upper Gwynedd and Towamencin much like the rapid growth the borough experienced a half-century earlier. The venerable Lansdale/North Penn High School was no longer able to contain the influx of new students. In 1971 a new, massive high school campus was built in Towamencin, and Penn Street was converted into what is now Penndale Middle School.





The History of the North Penn Alumni Athletic Association Two Hall of Fames By Thomas F. Strickland Jr., President NPAAA, October 11, 2014

The NPAAA was founded in the year 2000 with a mission to uphold the standards and prestige of the North Penn High School athletic program and to encourage and promote higher education through scholarship awards to those student athletes who demonstrate courage and sacrifice during their athletic careers. The NPAAA expanded its mission in 2004 when a decision was made by the Board of Directors to establish a sports Hall of Fame to recognize those alumni from North Penn High School and its legacy schools who best exemplified those high standards while participating in athletics in the high school.

After the NPAAA voted to initiate an athletic Hall of Fame, the Board of Directors proceeded with defining its vision. First, the NPAAA had to establish a qualification criteria and organizational guidelines to provide a systematic methodology for selecting inductees. Once that was established, the NPAAA created three committees: one to research, prioritize and select the inductees; a second to determine appropriate inductee awards and method of recognition; and a third to initiate a fundraising campaign to provide the monies necessary to support the NPAAA's dual mission of scholarship awards and athletic recognition.

The mission of the NPAAA is sustained by a desire to provide future generations with a historical record of the outstanding student athletes and teams representing North Penn High School and its legacy schools (Hatfield High School, Lansdale High School, and North Wales High School). This history, which provides both a source of pride and a standard to emulate, dates back to 1887.

On October 8, 2005, the NPAAA hosted its Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony at North Penn High School. Fifty two athletes (spanning eight decades) and one team were inducted. The ceremony was attended by several hundred people and included the enthusiastic endorsement and participation of North Penn School District Officials. A program was provided that included the history of the schools, a history of the team inducted, and profiles of the inducted athletes. An announcement was made at this event about plans to establish a permanent Hall of Fame Wall in North Penn High School. This initiative was presented to North Penn High School Officials and was enthusiastically approved.

A fundraising campaign was initiated immediately following the Inaugural Hall of Fame Induction Event and by Mid-August 2006, the NPAAA raised sufficient funding to proceed with the creation of the Hall of Fame Wall. A vendor was selected to provide the raised metal plaques that would be installed on the Wall of Fame in North Penn High School. In addition, The North Penn Alumni Athletic Association, as part of its Sports Hall of Fame mission, gives Special Recognition to teams that did not achieve PIAA State Championship level, but won league a championship along with other NPHS league championship teams in any given year; or a team(s) that in the opinion of the NPAAA Board of Directors should be recognized for their unique contribution to North Penn High School sports history.

Three special recognition plaques have been installed on the Wall of Honor.

On May 16, 2011, the NPAAA Board of Directors again approved the expansion of its current mission of providing scholarships to senior student athletes and the creation of the Sports Hall of Fame, to establishing a "Lifetime Achievement Hall of Fame" to be installed in North Penn High School. The NPAAA has expanded its mission to honor North Penn High School and Legacy School graduates who have made significant contributions to society in the Arts, Business, Education, Legal, Medical, Performing Arts, Public Service, or the Sciences fields of endeavor. This initiative was presented to, and approved by, the North Penn School District Superintendent and North Penn High School Principal. The NPAAA has been provided a wall at North Penn High School (separate from the Athletic Wall of Honor) to display inductee profile plaques. This year (2014) we are inducting our fourth Lifetime Achievement award winner.

Since 2005 and including the Event on October 11, 2014 we have installed 140 plaques for the individual athletes, 27 team plaques, 4 Lifetime Achievement plaques, and four special recognition plaques on the Halls of Fame Walls of Honor.

He also led Scripps to acquire a 50% interest in UKTV, 10 cable and satellite channels co-owned by the BBC, and 100% of the Travel Channel International, allowing Scripps to expand its domestic Travel Channel franchise into 91 countries and 20 languages.


Prior to Scripps, Moyer led VOOM HD Networks, a new business unit started by Cablevision founder Charles Dolan, designed to provide abundant HD programming across 15 cable and satellite channels in the U.S. Under Moyer's leadership, VOOM HD also launched two pioneering HD channels into 36 countries overseas and was acclaimed for its innovative channel packaging and design. At Cablevision, the dominant cable operator serving New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut, he took the newly created post of President, Regional Programming. There he was responsible for five regional news channels, five hyper-local Traffic and Weather channels, and two city-centric lifestyle and entertainment services.

Moyer began his television career in 1985 as one of the first 20 employees hired at a newly launched cable service called "The Discovery Channel". Over the span of 13 years, he led communications and marketing, then programming, then all aspects of the domestic networks, Discovery Channel and TLC. Ultimately Moyer was the first to hold the title of Chief Creative Officer where he operated as the brand steward responsible for all Discovery product development across television, retail, and digital. While in charge of programming, Discovery was honored with five George Foster Peabody Awards for programming excellence.

Moyer's career in media was foreshadowed at North Penn High School where he served as editor of the Knight Crier and was introduced to film and video production through the high school art department. In 1971, The Knight Crier was judged one of the best high school newspapers in the country by the University of Oklahoma Journalism School, which led Moyer to participate in a summer program there as a "Future Journalist of America."

Before his jump to television, Moyer worked as a photojournalist, reporter, and night editor for a series of local newspapers, starting including the North Penn Reporter and Today's Post in Valley Forge, PA. During this time he began to free-lance as a photographer and completed a number of assignments for the North Penn School District, including several editions of its award-winning activities calendar and other informational booklets and brochures.

Moyer is the son of Hobart and Betty Lou Moyer, both long-time Lansdale residents. Moyer met his wife, Suzanne McCrory, at Bucknell University. Married 32 years, the Greg and Suzanne now reside in Mamaroneck, NY with their youngest son, Christopher. Their eldest, David Moyer is married and works for the State Department of Education in Honolulu, Hawaii.



Dan began his swimming career with the Fischer's Swim Team in the summer of 1977 and soon transitioned into year round swimming with the North Penn Aquatics Club. In 1986, Dan joined the North Penn High School Swimming and Diving team. Little did anyone imagine the impact that Dan would have on the North Penn Swimming program.

Capable of swimming almost any event in the lineup, Dan primarily focused his talents on butterfly and freestyle. Dan earned four varsity letters; was recognized as North Penn's Most Valuable Swimmer in 1989 and 1990; and set a total of eight North Penn Team and Pool records.

As a senior in 1990, and the co-captain of the team, Dan's determination and many years of hard work began to pay off. Going into the District I Championships, Dan was determined to swim his best two events, the 100 butterfly and the 100 freestyle. This posed a serious challenge since these events occurred directly one after the other in the order of events. Swimming back to back events would mean that Dan would finish the 100 butterfly, spend a few minutes warming down and then swim the 100 freestyle. It was an unheard of test of mental and physical endurance; but if he could qualify for states in both events the PIAA State Swimming Championships would be held over two days and there would be one day of rest between the events rather than 15 minutes. In what was an exceptional display of athleticism, Dan won both the 100 butterfly and 100 freestyle at Districts. Before the days end he was a three time District One champion having also swum the anchor leg of 400 Freestyle Relay. The 400 Freestyle Relay of Matt Krystopa, Derek Williams, Scott Walker and Dan Dunigan broke the District I 400 Free Relay record and this became the final achievement in crowning North Penn the 1990 District 1 Swimming and Diving Champions.

The 1990 PIAA State Championships was the final step in what had been a perfect season for North Penn. Based on the pre-meet seeding; North Penn and Bethel Park entered the PIAA State meet as the team favorites. In the first day of competition, Dan won his first state championship in the 100 butterfly. The gamble at districts had paid big dividends for Dan and the team, as they began to distance themselves from Bethel Park in team competition. In the second day of competition he was touched out for first and took second place in the 100 freestyle. The 400 Freestyle Relay also won gold and broke the state record. In 1990, the North Penn Swimming and Diving team won the PIAA State title behind the scoring of Kevin Faikish, John Raeburn, Kyle Kroberger, Mike Wilkens, Scott Walker, Matt Krystopa, Derek Williams and Dan Dunigan.







In 1991, Scott walked away from North Penn Swimming as one of the most accomplished sprinters in the program's history. Scott demonstrated that with dedication, hard work, and self-confidence, anything is possible.

In 1982, at age nine, Scott started swimming for the Nor-Gwyn swim team and eventually joined the North Penn AquaticClub.In those early years he was dedicated and worked hard, but there were few accomplishments that distinguished him from his peers.

But then during his junior year of 1989-1990, things began to change for Scott. He grew taller, got stronger and his training began to pay off. At the District I Championships, Scott placed third in the 200 Freestyle, fourth in the 100 Backstroke and qualified for the PIAA State Championships in both events. Scott was also a part of the 400 Freestyle Relay that set the District I record. North Penn won the District I Championships that year and moved on to the state championships. The team was in the running for the state team title and every point was important. At the meet Scott scored by placing 8th in the 200 Freestyle. He was also a member of the 400 Freestyle Relay of Matt Krystopa, Scott Walker, Derek Williams and Dan Dunigan that won and broke the state record. Behind the scoring efforts of Kevin Faikish, John Raeburn, Kyle Kroberger, Mike Wilkens, Matt Krystopa, Derek Williams, Dan Dunigan and Scott Walker, North Penn won the 1989-1990 PIAA State championships. The record setting 400 Freestyle Relay would be named as All-Americansand the 1989-1990 team was ranked eighth in the United States by the National Swim Coaches Association (NISCA). Motivated by his success, Scott's hard work in the pool and in the weight room continued in the spring and he approached the summer club season with optimism about what might be possible in his senior year. In a USS wimming meet in Buffalo, New York, Scott took a huge leap forward. The North Penn 400 Meter Medley Relay was in the water racing and had fallen off the Junior National qualifying pace. With the freestyle leg remaining Scott knew the only chance of making the cut would be his effort in swimming the final leg of the relay. Scott gave it his all and the relay qualified for Jr. Nationals. Scott's conversion split on that anchor leg was impressive. It was a near equivalent to the time that had won states that year. As the events of the three day meet continued to unfold, it was evident that Scott was evolving into a very talented swimmer.


Josh is employed at Constellation Energy and lives in West Chester, Pa. with his wife Stephanie and daughter Kathryn age 7 and son Matthew age 4.

While attending North Penn High School, Josh participated in soccer in the fall. He earned 3 varsity letters and received the MVP award in his senior year. During his first year in high school on the soccer team, he was the only sophomore that started on the varsity team. He played on the front line at left wing mainly focusing on offense. His junior and senior years, he settled back in his more comfortable position at center halfback where he could play defense and offense. Josh played under coach Dave Rittenhouse all three years and appreciated his leadership style.

During the winter, Josh wrestled and earned 3 varsity letters. He wrestled all three years under legendary coach Ed Klavon, who had also coached his father and brother as well. 

2003 Boys Swim Team - One More Time

The 2002-2003 North Penn Swimming and Diving team, led by Coach Brian Faikish and assistant coaches Brian Daly and Sue McDonald, kept the tradition alive this season by extending their national record dual meet winning streak to 228 consecutive wins dating back to 1986. In addition to this monumental feat, the Knights won the Suburban One League Championship, as well as the District One Championship for the 15th straight year. The highlight of the season happened in March when the team captured the PIAA State Championship, the 5th PIAA State Championship in the past seven years.

The depth of the boys' team has always been a key factor to their success. "Every year we have underclassman step it up and swim faster than anyone expected," commented Senior Captain Brett Kratz, "This season was no different". In total, the Knights qualified seventeen swimmers for the District meet and advanced eleven onto the state meet. Although underclassman helped provide a great deal of depth, the seniors of the team shined when called upon. Along with Kratz, fellow seniors Brennan Lodge, Jeff Chiang, Nick Fanslau, Carter Hayes, and Jake Taylor helped carry the team throughout the season and into the District and State meets. "The seniors as a whole drove me to do my best and always led by example," said Junior Mike Kerr.

One of the many other key components for the Knights was the strength of their divers. Coached by Sue McDonald, the foursome of Senior Todd Gibson, Juniors Brendan Detweiler and Ryan Gengler and sophomore Josh Myers battled for the top three dual meet spots all year long. The fierce competition between these talented divers brought out the best of them in the District meet when Meyers advanced to states with his third place finish and Gibson and Detweiler finished in the top 12.

At the PIAA Championship meet, the Knights domination continued. All three relays took gold and strong individual performances from seniors Brett Kratz and Nick Fanslau; juniors Mike Kerr, Brad Oglevee, Matt Bauer, Chris Salamone and Dan McKeever and sophomores Adam Reynolds and Josh Myers insured the title for the team, the first since 2000.

2004 Boys Swim Team - Victory Lap

The 2003-2004 North Penn Boys Swimming and Diving Team was faced with a monumental task. Having graduated its strongest class in years in the Class of 2003, they suddenly found the legacy of a decades-long winning tradition thrust upon them. Led by captains Brad Oglevee and Dan McKeever and head coach Brian Faikish, assistant coaches Brian Daly and Sue McDonald, the team sought the 11th state championship in this storied program's history.

Although many throughout the state doubted them, these persistent young men rose to the challenge against all expectations but their own. From a strong showing at the Parkland Invitational to huge dual meet victories against strong Emmaus and Souderton teams, these hardworking young men proved their mettle and showed the depth of this team extended far beyond just one class.

After taking home a first place trophy from the Wilson Relays for the first time in four years, the Knights went on to dominate the Suburban One League Championship meet and then to capture their 16th consecutive District One Championship.

The defining moment of the season, however, came two weeks later. The Knights arrived at the PIAA State championship meet as underdogs, but in a grand final showing of strength, perseverance and determination, they silenced their critics once and for all by winning their second straight PIAA state title.

By extending the team's winning streak to 241 consecutive dual meets, 32 Suburban League Championships in a row, 16 straight District One Titles and having turned one state championship into a back-to-back run, this unlikely team earned their part of the North Penn Swimming and Diving Legacy, a long standing tradition of swimming excellence. 2004 Boys Water Polo - Season of Dominance

The 2004 North Penn Boys Water Polo Team accomplished something that had eluted the program since 1996 – a state title. Led by Coach Brian Faikish and assistant coaches Jason Grubb and Jeff Faikish, the Knights captured the State Championship topping off a season of dominance.

The Knights produced an impressive overall record of 28-1. In addition to winning the State Championship, they also captured first place in the Eastern Division as well as placing second at the prestigious Beast of the East Tournament, which is host to the best teams from the East Coast of the United States.

Early in the season, the Knights knew this year could be special based on the fact they were undefeated and had outscored their opponents 92-45 after only nine games. The only blemish of the 2004 season occurred during the 10th game when they lost their only match to the nationally ranked squad from Greenwich, CT. Due to the combination of outstanding leadership and hard work, this loss provided the team with the spark that fueled a 19 game winning streak as they pushed toward the end of the season.

The Knights had a strong senior class led by tri-captains Sean Gallagher, Josh Kratz and Drew Palumbo. Gallagher was one of the best goalies on the east coast and was the heart of our defense for three years. Quick in the water and clear decision maker, Kratz was the heart of our offense for three years and Brendan Fanslau sparked the offense with his quick aggressive drives. Andrew Jaycox, Palumbo, Tim McKeever, Kevin Ketterer, Adam Reynolds and Kyle Kushner added tremendous depth as drivers and outside shooters. Kelsey Britton was a tenacious 2 meter defender who was able to shut down the opposing teams' best offensive players.

At the state championship tournament, the Knights went in as the top seed and did not disappoint. They won their bracket by defeating Erie McDowell (12-5), Wyoming Valley West (14-7) and Wilson West Lawn (10-6) advancing to the championship game. The Knights saved their best for last. In a dominating performance over Governor Mifflin, the Knights jumped out to a 6-1 lead in the first quarter and eventually won the game by the score of 14-10.

The senior members of this team played a large part in the success of the season as well as those to come. They will be remembered not only by the impact they had in the water but by the impact they made on their teammates. Two more state titles (2006 & 2007) and a runner up (2005) will be won by the underclassman of the 2004 State Champion Water Polo Team.

NORTH PENN GIRLS TENNIS

Throughout the storied history of North Penn girls tennis there have been many exceptional players and many championship teams. From their first Bux-Mont Championship in 1959, captained by Judy McCann and coached by Laura Kehler, to the undefeated team of 1970 led by State Singles medal winner Lynn Koth and coached by Dottie Ball the team was a constant force in the Bux-Mont League claiming five titles between 1955 and 1976. New challenges were faced when girls tennis was shifted to a fall sport beginning with the 1977 season. Still, the team continued to post strong league records and another State Singles medalist in Lisa Wagner. Building on these early successes the girls program achieved its' "Golden Age" from 1983 to 1993. During this period the girls compiled an overall won-lost record of 127 - 25 and a league record of 92 - 16. They won seven league titles, three in the Bux-Mont League: 1983, '84, and '85 and four in the Suburban I League, 1988, 92, '93, and '94. In four of these years, 1983, '85, '88, and '93 the team was undefeated. Three of these teams had particularly exceptional seasons and players.

1985 UNDEFEATED BUX-MONT CHAMPIONS OVERALL 15 – 0 LEAGUE 8 - 0

Led by team captains Sherri Williams, Wendy Wenhold and Leonie Arano the 1985 Maidens completed an undefeated season (15-0, 8-0) and clinched their third consecutive Bux-Mont League Championship. This team arguably had the strongest, deepest singles line-up in school history. Sherri Williams won her second consecutive gold medal in the league Singles Championship while Kristina Maxwell claimed the bronze medal. In the league Doubles Championship Wendy Wenhold and Kate Holme repeated as champions. Each of the four singles players: Williams, Maxwell, Kate Holme, and Wendy Wenhold along with the first doubles team of Julee Wenhold and Rene Narducci were undefeated in league dual match play. (Clara Chu, Amy Narducci, Amy Bradley, Jenn Caiola, Cheri Blagbrough, and Lisa Hunn also played Varsity doubles during the '85 campaign.) Combining their talents in post season doubles play Sherri Williams and Kristina Maxwell won the District I Doubles Championship, defeating their teammates Wendy Wenhold and Kate Holme in the tournament finals. This marked the first time in District I history that a school captured the top two spots in the District I Doubles Tournament. Sherri and Kristina would go on to win the fourth place medal in the State Doubles Tournament. (In 1986, despite a strike shortened season that denied the team an opportunity to pursue a fourth consecutive championship, Kristina Maxwell and Kate Holme would win the District I Doubles Championship and capture the fourth place medal in the State Doubles Championship.)

1988 UNDEFEATED SUBURBAN I COLONIAL DIVISION CHAMPIONS OVERALL 15 – 0 LEAGUE 11 – 0

In 1988 the quest for another championship would not be realized unless the team was able to overcome their strongest opponent, Central Bucks West, in an epic season ending match between two undefeated teams. (The Bucks were on a 34 match unbeaten streak dating back to Oct. 8, 1986.) It was reported that nearly three hundred spectators surrounded the North Penn courts in support of the two teams. Play was intense and for five hours both teams performed brilliantly before North Penn prevailed with a dramatic, hard fought 5 -2 victory to post their fifteenth win of the season. The Maiden's success lay in the depth of their line-up: 4th Singles Robin Morinsky finished the year undefeated as did 1st Doubles Kristin Hinz/Jenn Ciaola, 2nd Doubles Pam Underwood/ Chris Eckard and 3rd Doubles Shannon Brown/Christine Buckmaster. (Monique Williams, Laurie Paul and Nicole Buckmaster played first, second and third singles respectively while Denise Murray and Leslie Kang also added individual wins during the season.) Each of the ten members of the starting line-up were named to either the first or second All-League teams. (Despite losing four seniors and failing to win the league championship, the 1989 team would finish 15 -2 and reach the semi-finals of the inaugural District I Team Championship!)

1993 UNDEFEATED SUBURBAN I COLONIAL DIVISION CHAMPIONS UNDEFEATED DISTRICT I TEAM CHAMPIONS OVERALL 18 – 0 LEAGUE 11 - 0

There was no State Team Tennis Championship until 2000, so in 1993 the ultimate goal was to be undefeated and win the District I Team Championship. That is exactly what the '93 Maiden's accomplished. After clinching their second consecutive Suburban I title the Maiden's defeated Upper Dublin, Conestoga and Abington to reach the District I Team Championship finals where they defeated Harriton 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ - 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ and secured the schools only District I Team Tennis Championship (boys or girls) in school history. Led by the sensational play of freshman #1 Singles, Lenka Beranova, and the steady play and leadership of Alison Tweedie and Kari D'Amora, the girls won a school record 18 matches. In addition to the District I Championship the team also won the Downingtown Invitational Team Tournament by dropping Downingtown, Radnor and State College. Alison (2nd singles), Kari (3rd singles), and Kathy Mallon (4th singles) finished dual match competition with undefeated records. The accomplished play of doubles duos Andrea Kapusta/Joanne Nasife, Kari Holloway/Erin Lukens and Marcy Wetzel/Kelly Stock was recognized when they were named to the All League Second Team. (After losing four seniors to graduation and freshmen Beranova to the boys team, the 1994 team won a third consecutive league championship with a 10 – 1 record. The team won a total of 16 matches including a first round victory over Pennridge in the District I Team Championship. Only the slimmest of margins, a third set tie breaker loss at first singles, kept the Maiden's from advancing.)




